Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Act Grant Awardees



Unfortunately, this might be the last group our office will be able to send to the St. Louis University School of Medicine Medicolegal Death Investigator Training Course.

The IOSME requested \$238,810 to fund 6 FTEs, the number of staff outlined in our pre-inspection accreditation report from the National Association of Medical Examiners in September. We were allocated 6 FTEs with only \$23,810. With this lack of adequate funding, we are unable to staff our office as required for accreditation from NAME. Without this accreditation, we may no longer be able to secure Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Act grant funds. In turn, we are unable to send County Medical Examiners and their investigators to St. Louis. With help and advice from our Advisory Council and the Interagency Coordinating Council we are hoping to rectify this situation. However, at this time the future is uncertain.

2007 legislation affecting our office:

HF925 2007 IDPH Omnibus bill
Status: Passed House & Senate to Governor
Sections of interest include:
Sec. 26. Section 144.28, subsection 1
If upon inquiry into the death, the county medical examiner determines that a preexisting natural disease or condition was the likely cause of death and that the death does not affect the public interest as described in section 331.802, subsection 3, the county medical examiner may elect to defer to the physician in charge of the patient's preexisting condition the certification of the cause of death.

HF 909 FY 2008 Health and Human Services Appropriations Bill
Status: Passed House & Senate to Governor
Sections of interest include:
An additional \$23,810 and 6 FTE's for staffing needs of the Office of the State Medical Examiner

SF 473 A bill for an Act allowing a competent adult to execute a written instrument directing the final disposition of that person's remains, including coordinating provisions, and providing applicability dates.
Status: The bill passed the Senate and was sent to the House for consideration. The House did not take action on this bill.

SF 509 AN ACT RELATING TO A REVISED UNIFORM ANATOMICAL GIFT ACT, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES.
Status: Signed April 5, 2007; Effective July 1, 2007
Sections of interest include:
142C.4A COOPERATION BETWEEN MEDICAL EXAMINER AND ORGAN PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATION == FACILITATION OF ANATOMICAL GIFT FROM DECEDENT WHOSE BODY IS UNDER JURISDICTION OF MEDICAL EXAMINER.

ME 101 ON THE ROAD

What will be covered in ME 101 On the Road?

- Discuss the scientific basis of human identification.
- Identify the necessary tasks at infant death scene investigations.
- Describe the types of deaths investigated in Iowa.
- Discuss the Medicolegal system and administrative rules pertinent to death investigation in the state of Iowa.
- Determine which cases come under medical examiner jurisdiction and which ones need to have an autopsy.
- Discover strategies for establishing cost effective contracts for body transportation and reimbursement for medicolegal death investigation.
