HISTORY

HISTORICAL SKETCH

It was in January, 1857, while the third constitutional convention was engaged in revising the Constitution of the State in the Old Stone Capitol at Iowa City that the Sixth General Assembly, which was then in session in the same historic building, voted a permanent annual appropriation of \$250 "for the benefit of a State Historical Society", which was organized on February 7, 1857.

According to its original constitution The State Historical Society of Iowa consisted of members who were admitted upon election by the Society or by the Board of Curators and the payment of an "admittance fee" of three dollars. The members of the Society held regular annual meetings at which officers were

elected and new members admitted. Upon the Board of Curators was conferred full power to manage the affairs of the Society.

At the outset the State seems to have exercised no direct control over the organization and administration of the Society. But as time went on a feeling arose in favor of bringing the Society and the State into closer relations, since the Society existed for public purposes and was supported by State appropriations. Accordingly, in 1872 an act was passed by the Fourteenth General Assembly "to Reorganize the State Historical Society". By this act the Society was made a *State institution* in the fullest sense of the term. Since 1872 no substantial changes have been made in the organization of the Society which is now provided for under Title XIII, Ch. 18, of the *Code of 1897*.

As the State has grown older the support of the Historical Society has become more liberal. The original annual al-

lowance was \$250. This sum was increased to \$500 in 1860. Twenty years later it was fixed at \$1000. In 1902 the permanent annual support of the Society was raised to \$2500. In 1904 it was placed at \$7500. And finally in 1907 it was increased to \$12,000. In the meantime special appropriations amounting to \$19,250 were voted by the General Assembly.

Since its establishment in 1857 The State Historical Society of Iowa has been located at Iowa City, under the auspices of the State University. At first it occupied rooms in the Old Stone Capitol. In 1862 its library and collections were removed to the Mechanics Academy building. Three years later the Society was authorized to use "the Library Room and Cabinet of the University for their purposes as a Society, with leave to hold the annual meetings of the Society in the University Chapel". In June, 1868, the Board of Curators leased the Old Stone Church on Burlington

Street, which served as headquarters until 1882 when better quarters were secured in a building on Washington Street. Finally, in September, 1901, in accordance with the wishes of the General Assembly, the Society was assigned rooms in the Hall of Liberal Arts.

RESEARCH

HISTORICAL RESEARCH

Responding to the progress that has been made in recent years in the application of scientific methods in nearly every sphere of human interest and activity and dominated by the spirit and standards of modern scholarship, The State Historical Society of Iowa has come to make historical research its chief function. Indeed, in this respect The State Historical Society of Iowa is almost unique, its financial resources and its administrative efforts being directed largely in the channels of scientific research and critical publication.

It is true that heretofore in most States the principal function of the State historical society (as well as of the private historical society) seems to have been that of collection, preservation, and exhibition — leaving historical research,

for the most part, to individual initiative. But with The State Historical Society of Iowa, on the other hand, historical research and publication have become the dominant activity. Through its organization and institutional activities the materials of State and local history are discovered, critically investigated by specialists, compiled, edited, and published.

Thus, instead of simply attempting to make the largest possible collection of historical materials in one place (namely, in the Society's library), this Society endeavors to compile, publish, and distribute the greatest amount of accurate, scientific historical literature. Instead of simply hoarding books and manuscripts for the use of the few, the Society aims to make the history of the State accessible to the many. For example, instead of being content with the discovery and acquisition of the Letters and Papers of Governor Lucas, the Society undertook to compile and publish

an exhaustive biography of the Governor as well as to edit and publish his Journal of the War of 1812 and his Executive Journal as Chief Magistrate of the Territory of Iowa.

The work of historical research and investigation is done largely by specialists, under the direction of the Superintendent. Neither partisan bias nor personal prejudice is allowed to enter into the work of those who are engaged in research for the Society.

It is, moreover, the aim of the Society to make every investigation exhaustive, to discover and utilize all sources of information. When necessary, investigators are sent to libraries and collections in other States for data. The Public Archives at Des Moines, Iowa, and at Washington, D. C., are exploited. Through the coöperation of libraries it is possible to secure the loan of books and manuscripts, thus reducing in many cases the expense of the research. Especially does the Society benefit in its re-

search work by the hearty coöperation of the Library of Congress, the Department of Historical Research of the Carnegie Institution at Washington, the State Historical Society of Wisconsin at Madison, and the Historical Department at Des Moines.

But libraries and archive depositories are not the only places visited by the researchers of The State Historical Society of Iowa. In preparing the biography of Robert Lucas, for example, the author spent weeks in the towns of Ohio, the early home of the Governor; while work on the biography of John Chambers led him to many different places in Kentucky.

As soon as the support of the Society will permit, the establishment of a bureau of historical research both at Des Moines and at Washington, D. C., is contemplated. Indeed, the Society hopes to be able to serve promptly and freely all legitimate requests from the citizens of the State for historical information.

LIBRARY

HISTORICAL LIBRARY

Since its establishment in 1857, The State Historical Society of Iowa has maintained a library of books, pamphlets, and manuscripts for the use of those interested in the study of Iowa and American history as well as for the benefit of those who either upon their own initiative or under the direction of the Society are engaged in scientific historical research. It was not, however, until the removal of the Library to the Hall of Liberal Arts in 1901 that the entire collection was completely classified, accessioned, and shelf-listed according to modern library methods. An inventory of the Library taken in July, 1909, records the following statistics:

Besides the large collection of miscellaneous titles bearing upon the general and local history of Iowa, the Mississippi Valley, and the United States, the Library contains the various official and scientific publications of the United States Government, publications issued under the authority of the State of Iowa, the laws of the Territories and States of the Mississippi Valley, and the publications of the various historical, scientific, and learned institutions of the whole country. In recent years an effort has been made to collect the writings of Iowa authors.

During the year from July 1, 1908, to July 1, 1909, the Society acquired for its Library approximately 4,000 titles, comparatively few of which were purchased. Indeed, the principal sources of acquisition for the Library are through exchange, solicitation, and voluntary donation. Of the more recent gifts, the Governor Kirkwood Library, presented by Mrs. Samuel J. Kirkwood, is perhaps

the largest, and in some respects the most valuable.

The manuscript collections which have been acquired by the Society are securely kept under lock and key in steel safes. The largest collection of manuscript material which has come to the Society in recent years is the Letters and Papers of Governor Robert Lucas.
