Iowa Library Services (ILS)/State Library's two library locations, the Main Library in the Miller Building and the Law Library in the State Capitol, have added Iowa Workforce Development's **IowaWORKS Access Points** to all of our public computer workstations. Unemployed Iowans may use IowaWORKS during our regular business hours, 8:00 a.m.–4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday. There is no charge for this service and both live chat and phone assistance is available from IWD staff. ILS/State Library staff is also able to assist patrons with this service. In 2011, the Census Bureau released data from its 2010 Census that gave us a snapshot of our state and local communities. This release included population, race, Hispanic origin and occupancy data, and was used for redistricting purposes throughout the state.

The Census Bureau also completed another cycle of its American Community Survey. This survey replaced the “long form” found in previous decennial censuses and included data on employment, income, education, poverty, housing values, disability, and health insurance.

The site offers users the ability to choose specific geographies, and to create customized reports to meet their individual needs. In addition we provide custom statistical profiles of Iowa communities and special population groups.
