Job Land surveyors plan, organize, and direct the work of one or more survey parties engaged in measuring distances, directions, and angles between points and elevations of points, lines, and contours on the earth's surface. They plan the fieldwork to determine the precise location of natural and constructed features of the survey project area; research legal records to look for evidence of previous boundaries; develop new data from photogrammetric records; determine methods and procedures for establishing or reestablishing survey control; keep accurate notes, records, and sketches to describe and certify work performed; and, coordinate findings with work of engineering and architectural personnel, clients, and others concerned with the project.

- **Education &** An applicant for licensure in land surveying must have graduated from a postsecondary course of two years or more in mathematics, physical sciences, mapping and surveying, or engineering. After successfully passing an eight-hour examination on fundamental surveying subjects, the applicant can be certified as a land surveyor intern. Those who complete four years of acceptable experience as a land surveyor intern are qualified to take the eight-hour Principles and Practice of Land Surveying examination. Licensure as a land surveyor will be granted to those who pass the second examination.
- **Continuing** Thirty hours of continuing education are required biennally for license renewal. **Education**
- **Examination** The Fundamentals of Land Surveying Examination is an eight-hour closed book examination that is administered twice a year. The Principles and Practice of Land Surveying Examination, also offered twice a year, consists of a 6-hour open-book examination and a two-hour closed book lowa Specific Land Surveying examination.
