COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UPDATE

Update. The following is an update of the collective bargaining process through March 15.

Public Professional and Maintenance Employees (PPME). Bargaining and arbitration have concluded between the State and PPME for FY 2014 and FY 2015. The final agreement includes:

- Across-the-board pay increases of 1.5% in each year (arbitration).
- Step increases that average 1.5% for eligible employees in both years (arbitration).
- No change in health insurance benefits in either year (agreement).

Judicial American Federal of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME). Bargaining has concluded between the State and Judicial AFSCME for FY 2014 and FY 2015. The parties agreed to follow the agreement:

- No across-the-board pay increase for either year.
- Step increases that average 4.5% for eligible employees in both years.
- No change in health insurance benefits in either year.


Central AFSCME. Bargaining and arbitration have concluded between the State and Central AFSCME for FY 2014 and FY 2015. The final agreement includes:

- No across-the-board pay increase for either year (agreement).
- Step increases that average 4.5% for eligible employees in both years (agreement).
- No change in health insurance benefits in either year (arbitration).

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY BUSINESS INCENTIVES

The Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) has two main components for business incentives through the High Quality Jobs Program: tax credits that are capped at \$120.0 million annually and cash incentives that are appropriated by the General Assembly. Within these tax credits and funds there are other programs that have mandatory and discretionary allocation amounts.

House File 2337, section 16 (FY 2013 Economic Development Appropriations Act) appropriated \$15.0 million from the Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund (RIIF) for High Quality Job Creation Financial Assistance. This is the successor program to the Economic Development (formerly Grow Iowa Values)

Fund Financial Assistance Program. The table below reflects the adopted budget, estimated monthly utilization, and balance available to date through FY 2013.

Additionally, the previous Economic Development Fund has an unobligated balance of \$15.1 million as of January 31, 2013.

The IEDA also has a tax credit cap that was established for FY 2010 in lowa Code section 15.119. Last year, the IEDA presented a report to the Legislative Tax Expenditure Committee on its history and utilization. If the IEDA exceeds the cap for a given fiscal year, the amount in excess is counted against the next fiscal year. Although the IEDA did not award more than \$120.0 million in FY 2012, it did run up against the cap once the mandatory \$10.0 million allocation for Innovation Fund Tax Credits and Community-Based Seed Capital Fund Tax Credits were included. No tax credits were awarded for these programs in FY 2012. The table to the right outlines the historical utilization. The table below reflects the adopted allocations and the year-to-date utilization.

BOARD OF CORRECTIONS MEETING

Recent Events. Deputy Director Diann Wilder Tomlinson updated the Board of Corrections on recent events during the meeting on March 8, 2013. The Department of Corrections (DOC) provided tours to the members of the Justice System Appropriations Subcommittee at Mitchellville, Fort Madison, and Fort Des Moines. The DOC pharmacy, through a grant with Iowa Pharmacy Corporation and the Office of the Attorney General, has funds to provide three months of medication to mentally ill offenders released from prison. Offenders should be under the care of community medical providers by the end of three months. A research plan is in place to determine if this pilot project is successful in reducing recidivism. The pilot project will start April 1, 2013.

Legislative Update. Board member Johnie Hammond asked if the DOC has taken a position on the legislation dealing with juvenile offenders that have been sentenced to life in prison. Deputy Director Wilder Tomlinson indicated the DOC has not done so. The federal Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) requires juveniles convicted as adults and sentenced to prison to be housed separately from adult offenders. The DOC is in the process of designating prison space to comply with the PREA.

Budget Update. Deputy Director Brad Hier updated the Board on the budget process. Both the House and Senate have released budget targets but no more details are available at this time. Fred Scaletta provided information on legislation that may impact the DOC. He indicated the DOC supports the DNA legislation.

Policy Process. Assistant Attorney General William Hill discussed the process the DOC uses to develop and implement policies. Occasionally, offenders file lawsuits regarding these policies, especially when

security issues are involved. Mr. Hill indicated there is clear statutory authority for the Department to set its own policies for operating the prison system. Deputy Director Jerry Bartruff reviewed policies for administrative segregation, disciplinary detention, and the transition incentive policy with the Board. Offenders have due process rights and Administrative Law Judges hold hearings in cases of disciplinary detention.

VETERANS TRUST FUND BALANCE

Fund Balance. As of February 28, 2013, the Veterans Trust Fund Balance total is \$17.2 million. The total principal balance is \$16.8 million. The total spendable portion of the Trust Fund balance (including the interest income and the FY 2013 lottery transfer) is approximately \$443,000. Expenditures to date for FY 2013 have totaled approximately \$126,000.

STATE APPEAL BOARD

Members and Duties. The State Appeal Board is comprised of the Auditor of State, the Treasurer of State, and the Director of the Department of Management, in accordance with <u>lowa Code section 24.26</u>. Officers of the Board include a Risk Manager from the Department of Management and Legal Counsel from the Attorney General's Office. The Board approves or rejects claims against the State or its employees, and helps resolve local budget protests. Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month.

March Meeting. The Board met on March 4, 2013. At the meeting, the Board reviewed general claims, in accordance with <u>lowa Code chapter 25</u>, ratified tort claims, in accordance with <u>lowa Code chapter 669</u>, and reviewed newly submitted settlements and judgments by the Attorney General's Office. The Board approved approximately \$12,700 in general claims and \$19,800 in tort claims. Several of the tort claims were related to vehicle claims against the Department of Transportation due to damage that snow plows may have caused other vehicles.

Settlements. The Board approved three new settlements made by the Attorney General's Office for various lawsuits. These include:

- A \$50,000 settlement was made in a lawsuit alleging that the University of Northern Iowa was negligent in responding to a 2004 sexual assault case.
- A \$200,000 settlement is the State's portion of a total \$1.2 million settlement for a tort claim related to an accident that occurred on a recreational trail located on the Oakdale Campus at the University of lowa. The City of Coralville was also a defendant in the case.
- A \$60,000 settlement was made in a lawsuit that alleged a driver of a State vehicle was negligent. In each case, the Attorney General's Office determined that it was in the best interest of the State to settle rather than go to trial.

IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK (ICN) OFFEROR CONFERENCE AND REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS (RFP) UPDATE

Offeror Conference Held. The ICN held a conference for potential bidders on the RFP to sell or lease the ICN on February 28, 2013, at the Joint Forces Headquarters in Johnston. After the conference, participants were invited for a tour of the ICN operations center.

Attendees. Representatives attended from several interested parties. Attendees included the Midwest Rural Telemedicine Consortium, Iowa Network Services, Iowa Public Television, Iowa Cable & Telecommunications Association, Windstream, Telephone and Data Systems, Inc., Mediacom, Central Scott Telephone Company, Jefferson Telecom, Iowa Association of Municipal Utilities, IP Pathways, LLC, Iowa Telecommunications Association, and the Iowa Association of Community College Trustees.

Joint Resolution. In accordance with the 2011 Acts, the ICN must complete its bidding process and analysis of the results by June 30, 2013, so the RFP to sell or lease the ICN has a deadline for submission of bids by April 30, 2013. In anticipation of complicated bids and a lengthy preparation process, the Senate Commerce Committee approved <u>SSB 1210</u> on March 6, 2013, to provide additional time for bidders to submit their proposals to the ICN. The legislation, now <u>Senate Joint Resolution 9</u>, passed the Senate on March 18, 2013. The resolution extends the date for responding to the RFP through July 31, 2013. If approved, the Joint Resolution has the force of law and can extend the timeframe.
