About Us

General Information:

- Founded in 1887, under the motto "Iowa Forgets Not the Defenders of the Union."
- Third largest state-owned facility for veterans in the nation
- 650 residents, 850 staff and volunteers
- The beautiful campus spans almost 150 acres, with five main resident care buildings.

Requirements for admission to the Iowa Veterans Home:

- Honorably discharged veterans and/or their spouse or widow;
- Demonstrated medical or financial need; and
- Eligible for VA medical treatment.

Cost of care at the Iowa Veterans Home:

- Eligible residents are admitted without regard to their financial status.
- The cost of care includes all services (listed below) available at IVH.
- The rate of payment is based on the actual cost of care and the individual's ability to pay using available resources.

A Message from the Commandant

I am honored to be the leader of this team as we serve the veterans, their spouses, and all the members of the Iowa Veterans Home (IVH) community. Our mission is to provide the highest quality of care possible to our residents who have spent their lives protecting our freedoms. Over 850 staff, along with the ABM housekeeping staff, and hundreds of volunteers continue their dedication to providing superior care to Iowa's heroes.

IVH opened its doors to Iowa veterans in 1887 as the Old Soldiers Home. From that time, the Home has belonged to the people of Iowa, guided by the Iowa Legislature and the Iowa Commission of Veterans Affairs. Today, IVH is one of the *three* largest of the 140 state-owned facilities for veterans and family members in the nation. As in the past, IVH maintains its loyalty and dedication to American veterans.

Currently we are in the first phase of a four-phase project building new facilities which will be prepared to fully implement the person-centered care philosophy. This concept provides expanded opportunities for the resident to participate more with decision-making, socializing, and with their own care. IVH staff began embracing this philosophy in 2006. Staff continues their efforts towards more individualized care for each resident based upon their needs and wants.

As you study this Annual Report, I am confident that you will also embrace our Vision for the Future as we continue to be a vital asset to state government and veterans living in Iowa.



The Iowa Veterans Home has developed a four-phase Master Plan (*architect's rendition shown at left*) to construct new buildings and renovate existing structures to facilitate a shift from an institutional environment to a more home-like atmosphere (household concept) where residents have a private bedroom (with bath and shower) around a shared central living/dining/kitchen area. Residents will also gain more privacy, dignity, and choice to improve the quality of their lives.

Meeting the Budget Challenge

In response to the state-wide fiscal challenge during FY10, the IVH developed a plan that included the following strategies:

- Reduce overtime, including comp time;
- Leave positions vacant or delay refilling positions;
- Reduce all travel (for staff) and training costs;
- Reduce office supplies and inventory levels;
- Reduce contracted services; and
- Defer equipment purchases.

IVH sees this as an opportunity to be creative in meeting future budget challenges while continuing to provide quality care to our residents.



Expansion of the Dack Care Building (pictured left) will create additional space for dining, leisure activities, unit meetings, and family gatherings in a more home-like atmosphere. The projected cost for the Dack Expansion Project is \$3,458,954 funded by the Federal Veterans Administration Construction Grant program (\$2,248,320) and the State of Iowa (\$1,210,634).
