With an annual policy agenda, we advocate for laws and policies that improve the lives of women and girls.

The ICSW provides information to and about women in the many educational publications we create and maintain, available in both web and print form. Our resources are accessed by thousands of Iowans each year. On a daily basis, we represent women's issues on task forces and committees, disseminate data about women, and make referrals to state and local agencies regarding such topics as women's entrepreneurship, employment discrimination, female juvenile justice, and many others. The ICSW recognizes the achievements and value of women through the Iowa Women's Hall of Fame and celebrating women's history.
