A questionnaire was sent 120 employers, a sample of employers was interviewed personally.

The Strategic Intelligence Unit members had two tasks: to think creatively about problems associated with research and development in vocational and technical education, particularly about problems found within non-metropolitan areas, and also to conceptualize problems surrounding vocational and technical education so logical models of the total problem structure might be created.

Research Activities Unit conducted research studies dealing with (1) the school district decision-making process affecting vocational and technical education programs, (2) occupational problems and vocational training needs of Iowa high school youth, (3) interrelationships between home environment and employment, (4) manpower requirements in agriculture and in agri-business with training needs for these requirements, (5) problems of predicting change in technology, (6) contributions of psychology to interdisciplinary research in problems of vocational and technical education, (7) determinants of post-high school educational and occupational choices of Iowa farm boys, (8) an analysis of legal and political problems and strategy necessary for implementing programs under the Vocational Education Act of 1963, and (9) collection through a sampling technique of occupational data by skill clusters.
