WOMEN IN lowa: 2015

MARCH 2015

In 1981, the U.S. Congress passed a resolution establishing National Women's History Week. The week was chosen to coincide with International Women's Day, March 8. In 1987, Congress expanded the week to a month. Every year since, Congress and the lowa General Assembly have passed a resolution for Women's History Month, and the U.S. president and lowa's Governor have issued a proclamation.

1,557,015

The number of females in lowa in 2013. That exceeds the number of men (1,533,401). Males outnumber females in most of the five-year-age groups through the 40-44 age group. Starting with the 45-49 age group, women outnumber men. At ages 85 and over there are over twice as many women as men.

1,689,069

The projected female population of lowa as of July 1, 2040 according to Woods & Poole Economics, Inc. Women will constitute 49.7 percent of the states's total population on that date.

39.5

The estimated median age for the female population in lowa in 2013. The estimated median age for the state of lowa was 38.1. The male estimated median age was 36.8

Families and Children

21.7%

The percent of families with children under 18 in 2013 living in single-parent households with their mother compared to 9.2 percent living with their father. This compares to 69.1 percent living with both parents.

115,610

The number of lowa families with a female householder, no husband present in 2013. In 1970 there were 52,025 families with a female head of household.

674,738

Number of married women in 2013 (including those who are separated or have an absent spouse).

62.6%

Percent of unmarried lowans who are women in 2013. There are 740,483 unmarried (widowed, divorced or never married) women.

The number of Iowa women in 2013 who are veterans of the U.S. armed forces.

The number of girls enrolled in the state's elementary and high schools during the 2013-2014 school year, including preschool.

91.8

The graduation rate for girls in 2013. The graduation rate for boys was 87.6.

The percentage of women in lowa age 25 and over who had at least a high school education in 2013. This compares to 61.8 percent of women who had completed 4 years of high school or higher in 1970.

27.4%

The percentage of women in Iowa age 25 and over with a bachelor's degree or higher in 2013. This compares to 7.5 percent of women who had completed 4 years of college or higher in 1970.

87,172

Number of women in lowa 25 years and older with an advanced degree in 2013. (e.g., master's, professional, doctorate.) The number of men in lowa with an advanced degree in 2013 was 84,149.


The number of unduplicated women sport participants in Iowa's 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities in 2013.

The percent of lowa women age 16 years to 64 in the labor force in 2013. The percent of men in lowa age 16 to 64 in the labor force was 85.7%.

Industry **294**,840

The number of Iowa women in the Education, Health, and Social services industry in 2013. More women, 38.8% of Iowa's total female labor force, work in this one industry group than in any other.

12.3%

The percent of women who work in the Retail Trade estate industry in 2013, the second highest industry for the female labor force. Approximately 9.5 percent work in the finance and insurance industry; 9.2 percent work in manufacturing; 8.5 percent in the arts, entertainment and recreation industry; and 6.6 percent work in the professional, scientific, and management services.

Occupations

159,003

The number of lowa women in office and administrative support occupations in 2013. Women represent a wide variety of occupations in lowa. For instance, there are about 68,952 women in healthcare practitioner and technical occupations, 96,015 in management occupations and 73,637 in education, training and library occupations.

38.3%

The percent of women in Iowa in Management, business, science, and arts occupations in 2013.

The percent of the foreign-born population in 2013 that were female

Earnings \$23,771

The median earnings in 2013 inflation-adjusted dollars for full-time, year-round women workers in Iowa. Men in Iowa had median earnings of \$36,376.

Voting and Representation

53.0%

The percentage of registered women in Iowa who reported voting in the 2014 general election. The number of registered males who voted in the same election was 53.2%.

Iowa Secretary of State's office

28.6%
