

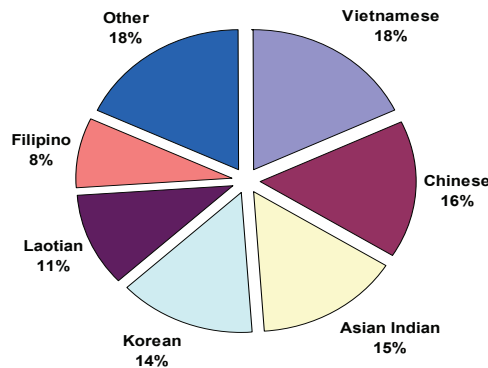
# ASIAN/PACIFIC AMERICANS IN IOWA MAY 2006

In 1978, a joint congressional resolution established Asian/Pacific American Heritage Week. The first 10 days of May were chosen to coincide with two important anniversaries: the arrival in the United States of the first Japanese immigrants (May 7, 1843) and the completion of the transcontinental railroad (May 10, 1869). In 1992, Congress expanded the 10-day observance to a month-long celebration.

The number of Iowa residents in 2000 who say they are Asian or Asian in combination with one or more other races. This group comprises 1.5 percent of the total population. The number Iowa residents who say they are Asian alone was 36,635.

## Age Distribution

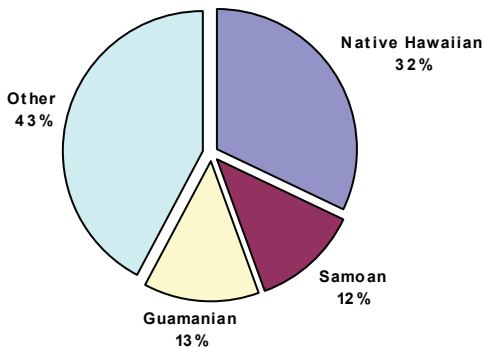
### 29.9%

The percentage of the native Hawaiian and other Pacific islander population that is under 18; 4.6 percent is 65 or over. Meanwhile, 27.7 percent of people identifying themselves as either Asian or Asian in combination with one or more other races are under 18; 4 percent is 65 or over.

The number of Iowa residents in 2000 who say they are native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander or native Hawaiian and other Pacific islander in combination with one or more other races. This group comprises 0.1 percent of the total population. The number of Iowa residents who say they are Pacific Islander or native Hawaiian alone was 1,009.

## Coming to America

### 30,162

The number of Iowa residents who were born in Asia. Asian-born residents comprise 33.1 percent of the state's total foreign-born population.

The percentage of Iowa's foreign-born from Asia who are naturalized citizens. The corresponding rate for the foreign-born population as a whole is 32.9 percent.

### 6,412

The estimated number of foreign-born people from Vietnam (Table: PCT019). Next to Mexico, Vietnam is the leading country of birth for the state's foreign-born. Also among the top 10 countries of birth for Iowa's foreign-born population are Korea, India, Laos and China.

## EDUCATION

The number Asians enrolled in the state's elementary and high schools during the 2004-2005 school year.

**34.0%**

Percent increase in Asian enrollment between the 1991-1992 school year and 2004-2005.

**42.9%**

The percentage of Asians, age 25 and over, who have a bachelor's degree or higher level of

education. Asians have the highest proportion of college graduates of any race or ethnic group in the state. The corresponding rate for all lowans in this age group is 21.2 percent.

The percentage of native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and older, who have at least a bachelor's degree.

**74.3%**

The percentage of Asians, age 25 and over, who are high school graduates. The corresponding rate for all lowans in this age group is 86.1 percent.

**78.6%**

The percentage of native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders, age 25 and older, who are high school graduates.

The percentage of Asians, age 25 and over, who have an advanced degree (e.g., master's, Ph.D., M.D. or J.D.). The corresponding rate for all adults in the age group is 6.5 percent.

ken languages are: Chinese (4,295); Laotian (3,940); and Korean (2,495).

Figure 1- Industry by Percent of Population

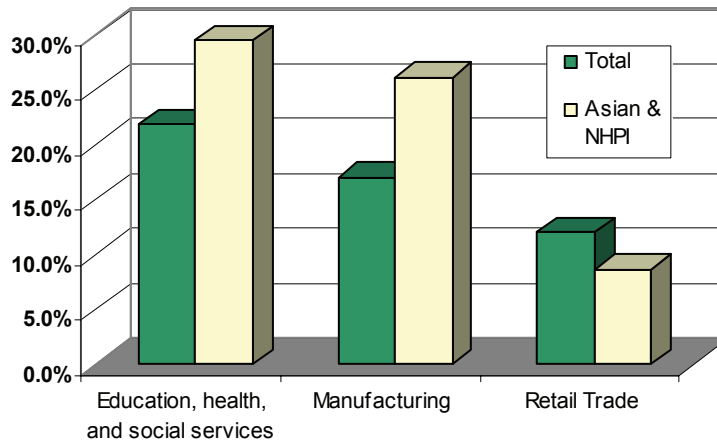
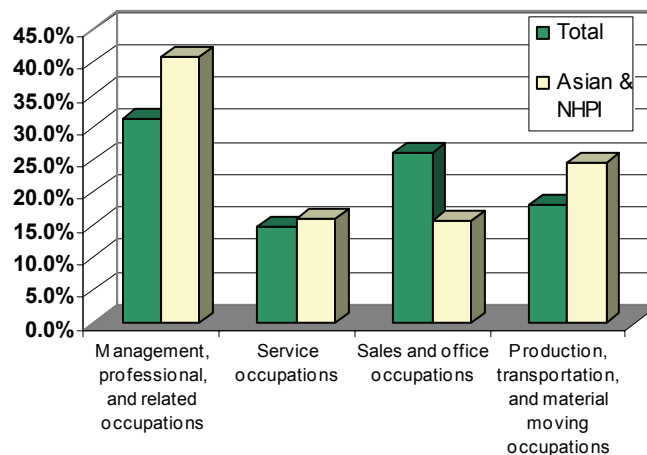

### 11,643

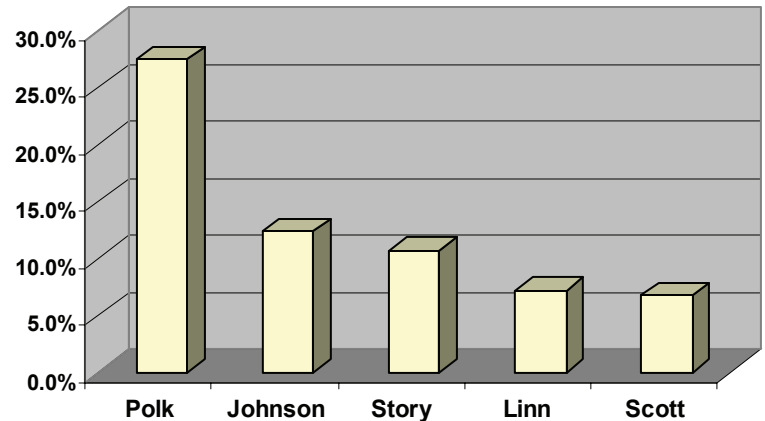
The number of Asians in Polk county in 2004, which has the largest population of this race of any Iowa county. Polk county has both the largest population and the largest numerical increase (1,785) of people in this group between 2000 and 2004.

Story county is where Asians make up the highest proportion of the total population (5.1 percent).

The number of native Hawaiians or Pacific Islanders in Polk county, which leads all counties in Iowa.

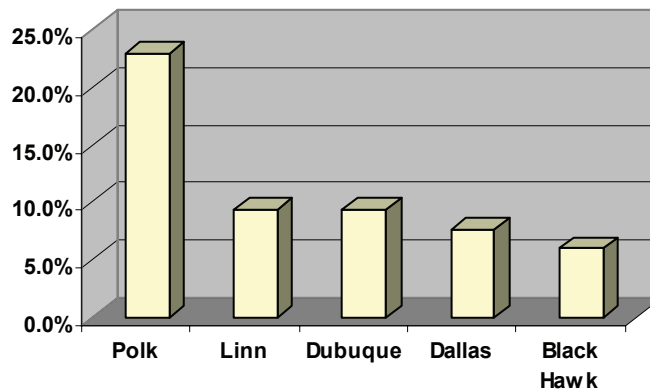
### Percentage of all Asians in Iowa: Top 5 Counties of Residence: 2004
