# AFRICAN-AMERICANS IN IOWA: 2011

To recall and celebrate the positive contributions to our nation made by people of African descent, American historian Carter G. Woodson established Black History Week beginning on Feb. 12, 1926. In 1976, as part of the nation's bicentennial, the week was expanded into Black History Month.

## 84,054

The estimated African American population in Iowa as of July 1, 2009. African Americans constitute 2.8 percent of the state's total population. In 1980 African Americans made up 1.4 percent of the state's total population.

# 42,354

The numeric change in the African American population from 1980 to 2009. This is a 101.6 percent increase for the period.

# 180,400

The projected African American population of Iowa as 2040. According to Woods & Pool Economics Inc., African Americans will constitute 5.2 percent of the state's total population.



# FAMILIES AND CHILDREN

#### 16,127

The number of African American families in 2009 who reside in Iowa. Of these families, 69.3 percent include their own children under 18 years of age.

#### 69.1%

Percent increase in the number of African American families in the state of Iowa from 1980 to 2009.

#### 29.0%

Percentage of African American families with children who live with both parents in 2009 compared to 69.1 percent for the state of lowa. In 1980 this percentage was 41.7 compared to the state of lowa's 83.6%.

#### 10.2%

Percentage of the African American population under age 5, as of July 1, 2009. African Americans have a higher concentration of preschoolers among the population than the state as a whole (6.8%). In 1980 the percentage of the African American population under age 5 was 10.9.

#### 3.02

The average family size for the Iowa African American population in 2008. The average family size in the state of Iowa is 2.90.

# COUNTIES AND CITIES

### 24,133

The number of African Americans in Polk County in 2009, making it the largest population of African Americans in any lowa county.

## 8.4%

The percent of total population in Black Hawk County who are African American in 2009. Other lowa counties with a high percentage of African Americans are Scott (7.2%), Polk (5.6%), Des Moines (4.4%) and Johnson (4.2%).

## 71.9%

Nearly three-fourths of the total African American population live in Polk, Scott, Black Hawk, Linn and Johnson counties in 2009.

### 61.5%

Over half of the growth in lowa's African American population from 2000-2008 occurred in four counties: Polk, Linn, Scott, and Johnson..

# 16,025

The number of African Americans in Des Moines in 2000, making it the largest population of African Americans in any city in Iowa.

#### 13.9%

The percent of the total population in Waterloo in 2000 who are African American. Other Iowa cities with a high percentage of African Americans are Davenport (9.2%), Balltown (8.2%), Des Moines (8.1%) and

Anamosa (6.1%).

# 56.0%

The percentage of Iowa's total African American population living in three cities: Des Moines, Waterloo and Davenport.

The percentage of African Americans who rent their home in 2009. The corresponding percentage for the state is 27.9%.

# 58.8%

The percentage of African Americans whose gross rent as a percentage of household income was over 30% in 2009. The corresponding percentage for the state is 43.8%.

# INCOME AND POVERTY

# \$25,311

The median income in the past 12 months of African American households in 2009. The median household income for the state during the same time period was \$48,044.

# \$26,850

The median income of African American families in Iowa in 2009. The median income of families in Iowa was \$61,156.

# \$17,677

The per capita money income of Iowa African Americans in 2009. The per capita money income for the state was \$25,315.

# 32.5%

The poverty rate in 2009 for the African American population. The corresponding rate for lowa is 11.8 percent.

# 42.0%

The percentage of families with related children under 18 below the poverty level in 2009 for the African American population. The corresponding rate for lowa is 13.6 percent

# 1,619

The number of African American-owned firms in lowa in 2002.

## 130.3%

The percent increase in African American-owned firms between 1987 and 2002.

### 10.8%

The unemployment rate for Iowa African Americans in 2009. The Iowa unemployment rate at that time was 4.1%.

#### 64.6%

The percent of Iowa African Americans age 16 and over in the labor force in 2009. The percent of Iowans age 16 and over in the labor force was 69.5%.

#### 64.9%

The percent of Iowa African Americans males age 16 and over in the labor force in 2009. The percent of Iowa African Americans females in the labor force was 64.3%. In comparison 74.1% of all men and 65.0% of all women age 16 and over were in the labor force in Iowa.

# **Earnings** \$18,622

The median earnings for lowa African Americans in 2009. The median earnings for the state of lowa was \$26,622.

# \$21,119

The median earnings for lowa African American males in 2009. African American women in lowa had median earnings of

\$14,651. In comparison the median earning for men and women in the state of lowa were \$32,744 and \$21,383 respectively.

# Industry 27.7%

The percent of lowa African Americans in 2009 employed in the educational, health, and social services industry.

## 20.7%

The percent of African Americans in 2009 who work in the manufacturing industry. Approximately 8.2 percent work in the arts, entertainment, recreation, accommodation and food services industry; 7.5 percent in retail trade; and 10.0 percent work in professional, scientific, management, administrative, and waste

management services.

# Occupation 20.9%

The percent of Iowa African Americans in 2009 in sales and office occupations.

### 26.3%

The percent of African Americans in Iowa age 16 years and over in management, professional, and related occupations in 2009. In Iowa this occupation accounts for 34.1% of all people age 16 years and over.

#### 28.5%


The percent of African American women in Iowa age 16 years and over in management, professional, and related occupations in 2009. 24.4% of African American men in Iowa are in this occupation.

# 35.3%

The percent of African American men in Iowa age 16 years and over in production, transportation, and material moving occupations in 2009. 12.5% of African American women in Iowa are in this occupation.

The percentage of lowa African Americans age 25 and over, with a bachelor's degree or higher in 2009. The percentage for lowa was 25.1%.

# 6.2%

Percentage of Iowa African Americans 25 years and older with an advanced degree in 2009. (e.g., master's, professional, doctorate.) The percentage of Iowans with an advanced degree was 7.4%.
