1) State Library Highlights for 2016: This is the last issue of *Monday Morning Eye-Opener* for this year, a good time to harken back. Like your libraries, the State Library had some noteworthy accomplishments this past year. So we're popping the cork on our Highlight Reel for 2016!

While we can't consider budget woes to be a highlight, the

agency met money worries with creative responses. With staff

resignations, positions were not replaced; instead jobs were re-assigned, office space at the Miller Building in Des Moines downsized to two floors, and other cost-saving measures put into place.

A notable improvement came in the spring with flipping the agency name from Iowa Library Services back to the original *State Library of Iowa*. Complementing the name change came a new logo and tagline: *State Library of Iowa—Information, Consultation, Destination.*





Standards for Iowa's public libraries were revised in 2016; the State Library Commission approved them in June, becoming effective in July. Substantive changes impacting libraries across all three funding tiers brought the topic of standards front-and-center at September's Town Meetings, plus many more reviews at individual county and board meetings throughout the fall season. If your library board would like a review of the changes, just let me know—"*Raising Our Standards*" is a timely topic!

Iowa library directors, staff, and trustees participated in State Library sponsored continuing education throughout the year. Roundtables, workshops, and webinars covered the gamut of topics. Just to name a few: adult programming, online health resources, PLA's Project Outcomes and ALA's Libraries Transform, one-book-one-community reading programs, designing with Infographics, and much more. Our Education Team met in Des Moines last week to plan the year ahead—I can promise plenty to choose from, beginning with the ILOC Conference on January 19. Join us for ILOC and many more educational opportunities for staff and boards in 2017!

2) Kids First Conference 2017—Presenters Welcome: The Kids First Conference, sponsored by the State Library, lands in odd-numbered years. Which means Kids First comes back in 2017! Never too early to "Save the Date"—May 1-2, with an additional half-day post conference on May 3. The location is Des Moines Holiday Inn Airport and Conference Center.

3) ILOC 2017 Conference Preview: Just over 1 month away—ILOC 2017! Sponsored by the State Library, ILOC stands for Innovative Libraries Online Conference and it's coming up quickly—January 19, 2017. This is a great chance for staff to pick up several c.e. credits for the day and all from the comfort of home or office. The 2017 theme is *"Lean Mean Library Machine."* It's a fun theme with many fun sessions on tap, including a new feature this year called "Library Hacks."

The morning keynote speaker is **Teresa Hay McMahon**, Executive Director of the Iowa Lean Consortium (ILC), a non-profit consortium of businesses, government, education, and healthcare. The ILC works to drive competitive performance improvements in Iowa organizations by expanding Lean culture and sharing lessons learned. Lean organizations eliminate waste in processes through active involvement of all employees engaged in non-stop improvement.

Another added bonus: **ILOC** is a wonderful opportunity for library boards to fulfil the standard that requires board education at a Tier 1 level. Remember in the 2016 revision of standards, #8 requires "all members of the library board of trustees participate in a variety of board development training each year..." Toward that end, there is an evening program for trustees. The evening keynote speaker is **Pat Wagner**; she is a trainer, consultant, and manager of Pattern Research, Inc. Pat will speak to the role that trustees can play in encouraging Lean Mean Library Machines!

Consider this: morning and evening keynote speakers, concurrent sessions on a variety of topics, plus a virtual exhibit hall—all online using Adobe Connect Classrooms and ZOOM meeting rooms. Come and go throughout the day, attending the sessions you're most interested in. A main goal of **ILOC** is to replicate the "in-person" conference experience, but in an online environment without cost, without travel !
