# STEM Survey Project



## **STEM Readiness in Public Libraries**

In this season of giving, here's an opportunity for your library to give back--input, that is. The Space Science Institute's National Center for Interactive Learning, in partnership with ALA and other alliances, is asking for public library input into developing a **STEM readiness tool**. Your input is important to understanding the current

state of **STEM** programming in public libraries nationwide; **STEM** standing for science-technology-engineering-math.

Organizers have designed a survey to gather librarian opinions about **STEM** programs and to gauge the amount of **STEM** activities that libraries are sponsoring. Consider things like LEGO clubs, technology-rich makerspaces, space-related programs like the solar eclipse viewing parties this past summer, etc.

The survey should take about 15 minutes to complete—click the button below to start. All responses are appreciated, even if your library has not offered much in terms of **STEM** programs. All information will be kept confidential and not traced back to individual libraries. Your responses will lead to understanding what resources and methods will be most useful for libraries to begin or advance **STEM** learning in your communities.

ALA recently announced her second pick: <u>Exit West</u> by Mohsin Hamid. Parker describes her choice: "Mohsin Hamid's <u>Exit West gives</u> a deeply real, beautiful, intricate, and electrifying look at what it means to be an immigrant right now. This tale of two people forced from their homeland and searching for a home elsewhere is transporting and illuminating. I was swept away by this gorgeous, otherworldly novel and I'm so excited to offer it as our second selection for **Book Club Central**, as I'm convinced every reader will feel the same."
