- Implementation Plans – a preliminary analysis of where Iowa may need to submit “Implementation Plans” with the state plan to indicate how we will come into compliance with new requirements

Shared Visions Awardees Announced

The Iowa Department of Education has announced the Awardees for Shared Vision Programs. The competitive grant application process resulted in a total of 67 applications being awarded funding out of the 89 total received. Final award amounts are contingent on the finalization of the state appropriation. FY16 grants are awarded with a renewal option of up to five years provided grantees meet program requirements. The next competitive grant process for Shared Visions Preschool Programs will be for FY21.
