
Prestigious Children's Book Awards



Newbery & Caldecott Medal Winners For 2018 Last month, the American Library Association announced the annual award winners in children's literature. Starting with the John Newbery Medal for the most outstanding contribution to children's books, the 2018 winner is <u>Hello, Universe</u> by Erin Entrada Kelly. *"…where Filipino folklore and real life converge at the bottom of a well…this tale shimmers with humor and authentic emotion."* The Newbery Medal has been awarded annually since 1922 by the Association for Library Services to Children (ALSC) a division of ALA.

Next is the **2018 Randolph Caldecott Medal** for the most distinguished American picture book for children, awarded to <u>Wolf in the Snow</u>, illustrated and written by Matthew Cordell.

"...a girl and a wolf cub get lost in the snow and rescue each other...such a deceptively simple book is such a dramatic story of survival." The Caldecott Medal has been



awarded annually since 1938, also under the sponsorship of the ALSC-ALA.

The **Coretta Scott King Book Award** recognizes African American authors and illustrators of outstanding books for children and young adults; <u>Piecing Me Together</u> by Renee Watson is the 2018 winner.

Literally dozens more children and YA literature awards were included in ALA's announcements, including the Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Children's Videos, the Laura Ingalls Wilder Award, the Theodore Seuss Geisel Award, etc. And this interesting category: the Alex Awards for the 10 best adult books that appealed to teen audiences.
