
2012-2022 Occupational Projections Summary

Region 13’s occupational employment is expected to increase by 10.5% from 2012 to 2022 (or 1.05% annually). Job growth will vary across major occupational groups depending on the industry. Service-providing occupations are generally expected to outperform goods-producing occupations. This is reflected in both employment change and growth rates.

Major occupational groups expected to grow at or faster than the regional annual average are business and financial (1.2%); computer and mathematical (1.5%); community and social service (1.6%); legal (1.5%); arts, design, entertainment, sports, and media (1.1%); healthcare practitioner (1.7%); healthcare support (1.6%); building/grounds cleaning and maintenance (1.6%); personal care (2.3%); construction (2.3%); installation, maintenance, and repair (1.2%); and transportation and material moving (1.3%). Growing less than the regional average include management (- 0.2%); architecture and engineering (0.8%); life, physical, and social science (0.8%); education (0.9%); protective service (1.0%); food prep and serving (0.9%); sales (0.9%); office and administrative (0.8%); farming, fishing, and forestry (0.1%); and production (0.9%) major occupational groups. A detailed look of 2012-2022 major occupational trends follows.

Region 13’s Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Growth, 2012-2022

Region 13’s top 13 occupations expected to have the largest employment growth for 2012-2022 will account for 2,830 (or 33%) of the projected 8,570 new jobs. The major occupational groups of healthcare; food prep and serving; sales; personal care; and transportation and material moving will account for 2,165 (or 77%) of the 2,830 new jobs as shown below.




Region 13's Occupations with the Largest Projected Job Decline, 2012-2022

Region 13 expects three occupations to account for an employment decline of 560 jobs for 2012-2022. Management occupations (primarily farmers, ranchers, and other agricultural managers) will account for 515 (or 92%) of the 560 jobs as shown below.

Region 13's Fast Growing Occupations, 2012-2022

Region 13's top ten occupations expected to have the largest percentage of employment growth for 2012-2022 are primarily in the personal care; construction; and installation, maintenance, and repair major occupational groups as shown below. In conjunction with strong growth, occupational employment levels are to be reviewed in determining the largest number of job openings.




Region 13's Fast Declining Occupations, 2012-2022

Region 13 expects the postal mail carrier occupation to have the largest percentage of employment decline for 2012-2022 as shown below. Employment costs, competition, technological change and other economic factors may contribute to deteriorating industry employment. While such occupations may be considered a source for employment, careful thought should be given to training time and costs.

Region 13's Occupations with the Most Annual Openings, 2012-2022

Region 13's top ten occupations expected to have the most annual openings for 2012-2022 will account for 765 (or 27%) of the projected 2,850 openings. The major occupational groups of management; sales; food prep and serving; healthcare; and transportation and material moving will account for 720 (or 94%) of the 765 openings as shown below.



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
