

Every President since JFK has issued a formal proclamation in May asking that the entire nation pay tribute in some way to older persons in their communities. Association in partnership with Carnegie-Stout Public Library (Dubuque) The voting included over 6,000 kindergarten and preschool children who voted for their favorite picture book between February 1 and April 30, 2018.

The mission of the **Bridge to Reading Picture Book Award** is to promote early literacy and reading to children by introducing quality picture books. The books are chosen based on characteristics of a good "read aloud." Children kindergarten age and younger are encouraged to develop a lifelong love of books and reading through their participation in the voting process. The award was formed as part of the *Campaign for Third Grade Reading* and administrated by a committee of librarians, teachers, and early literacy leaders.
