Managing Medication-Seeking Patients: Using Screenings and Brief Interventions

STR Grant Award Update

Last week lowa was awarded the Opioid State Targeted Response (STR) Grant. The project will expand capacity of the current provider network with a focus on accessible opioid treatment. Key steps to expand capacity will include a thorough assessment and strategic action plan involving local stakeholders. Funding will support planning and implementation of evidence-based practices, including medication assisted treatment (MAT).

The focus of this project is to assist providers across the state to build community capacity for a successful community response to the opioid crisis. Plans will include prevention-focused media, promotion of the Iowa Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP), expanded treatment options, and naloxone distribution. The Iowa Opioid STR project will leverage the service improvements gained through other opioid-focused efforts, making evidence-based practices more accessible to Iowans affected by opioid use disorder across the state.

Linda B. Kalin Presentation - Pills & Thrills that Kill: What's Trending

If you attended the 40th Annual Governor's Conference on Substance Abuse, then you heard Linda Kalin from the Iowa Statewide Poison Control Center talk about a variety of misused substances. Some statistics she shared specific to opioids were:

- Sales of Rx opioids nearly quadrupled from 1999-2014
- Opioid overdoses have quadrupled since 1999
- In 2015, opioids represented 73% of all overdose deaths
- Heroin overdose deaths rose 23%
- Synthetic opioid overdose deaths rose 73%
