Auditor of State Rob Sand today released a report on the Iowa School for the Deaf, Council Bluffs, Iowa for the year ended June 30, 2018.


The School is governed by the Board of Regents, State of Iowa and provides an education commensurate with the needs of students who are Iowa residents and less than twenty-one years of age with hearing loss which is too severe to acquire an education in the public schools. The School also provides services for residents of the State of Nebraska upon such terms as may be fixed by the Board of Regents. For the year ended June 30, 2018, the average enrollment was 96 students with an average cost per student of \$106,394, compared to an average enrollment of 108 students and an average cost per student of \$100,672 for the prior year.


Dear Board Members:

- * For fiscal years 2018, 2017, 2016, 2015 and 2014, capital outlay for construction in progress or storm damage totaling \$594,227, \$221,777, \$568,075, \$586,608 and \$473,428, respectively, paid by the Iowa School for the Deaf were removed from costs for purposes of this computation.
- ** Included in the average cost per student are expenditures for outreach services for which the costs have not been identified separately. During the year ended June 30, 2018, the School provided outreach services to 0 off campus students compared to 8, 5, 0 and 0 off campus students, respectively, in each of the preceding four years ended June 30, 2017.
