## National Report Highlights Iowa's Progress in Closing the K-12 Digital Divide

Governor Reynolds announced that Iowa's classrooms are more connected today than ever before. 100 percent of K-12 students in Iowa now have access to high-speed broadband on par with the Federal Communications Commission's minimum goal of 100 kbps per student, opening the door to expanded opportunities for teaching and learning in Iowa's classrooms.
