Job Commercial manure applicators charge a fee and are in the business of applying manure **Description** on the land of another person. Commercial applicators: evaluate field conditions and the nutrient content of manure from different storage systems; evaluate crop nutrient needs to determine if proposed application rates are appropriate; read and interpret manure management plans; and, calibrate and operate equipment to prevent over-application of manure that might create surface or groundwater contamination.

Required

Education & Formal education or supervised practice is not required to become a commercial manure **Experience** applicator. However, an applicant must take three hours of training annually or pass an examination administered by the Department of Natural Resources. Iowa State University Extension Service offers satellite training in early January.

> Those commercial applicators that handle septic tank or other private waste need an additional license.

Continuing Applicants must take three hours of training annually or pass an examination **Education** administered by the Department of Natural Resources. Applicants can contact their local Extension office for information on training courses or check the website at: http://extension.agron.iastate.edu/immag/certificationFr.html

Examination

An individual must attend three hours of training approved by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) or pass an examination for initial certification and to renew a certificate. Exams are given at the DNR's six field offices, but must be scheduled in advance. Special needs can be accommodated if requested at least 30 days in advance. "PM-1778 Commercial Manure Certification Study Guide" may be helpful in studying for the test. The cost of the study guide is listed below under "Fees."
