Job Description	Nail technologists apply sculptured nails, nail extensions, wraps, overlays, nail art or any other nail technique to the fingernails and toenails of a person. Also, they manicure people's nails, remove excess hair (by use of depilatories, wax or tweezers), and massage the hands, arms, ankles, and feet.
Education & Experience Required	<p>Applicants must successfully complete a 325-hour course in nail technology from an approved school, consisting of a minimum of 150 hours of core life sciences, 50 hours of nail technology theory, 125 hours of applied practical instruction, and pass the required national and state exams.</p> <p>Nail technologists from other states must apply to the testing service.</p>
Continuing Education	Eight hours of continuing education are required biennially of which four hours must be in the prescribed practice discipline for license renewal.
