DES MOINES – DNR staff work with individuals, businesses and communities to help them protect our natural resources by complying with state and federal laws. This approach is very effective. In the few cases where compliance cannot be achieved, the DNR issues enforcement actions. The following list summarizes recent enforcement actions.

Consent Orders

A consent order is issued as an alternative to issuing an administrative order. A consent order indicates that the DNR has voluntarily entered into a legally enforceable agreement with the other party.

Calhoun County

Cole Blair

Submit a complete original MMP with filing and indemnity fees and pay a \$3,000 administrative penalty.

Clay County

Cooperative Energy Company, LLC

Pay a \$10,000 administrative penalty.

Osceola County

Short and Tall Enterprises, Inc.

Cease illegal solid waste dumping and open burning, properly dispose of remaining solid waste on site, and pay a \$797 administrative penalty.

Story County

Ronald Stratton, Dennis Stratton, & Nathan Stratton

Restore Wolf Creek's channel to its original location and pay a \$5,000 administrative penalty.

Air Quality permits under review

DES MOINES – The DNR Air Quality Bureau has the following draft permits up for review. The permits help protect Iowans' health and air quality. DNR's permitting staff review each permit application to ensure facilities comply with state and federal air quality requirements. We encourage public comments on draft permits, providing help on how to make-effective comments. Submit written comments to the assigned permit writer before 4:30 p.m. on the last day of the comment period. DNR considers public comments before finalizing the permits.

Title V Operating Permits

Title V Operating permits are reviewed and re-issued every five years. Facilities with a Title V permit have the potential to emit large amounts of air pollutants compared to other facilities. The five-year reviews are a federal requirement and ensure adequate monitoring is included in the permit. The DNR plans to issue Title V Operating Permits for the following facilities. The application was submitted to operate their existing Medicinal Chemicals and Botanical Products facility. The public comment period ends May 16.
