



More than \$2 million in grants awarded for Iowa history & culture

Cue the trumpets: The Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs recently announced [more than \\$2 million in 176 grants](#) for cultural organizations and projects across the state, funded by the Iowa Legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts.

This year's list includes more than \$500,000 in 32 grants the State Historical Society of Iowa awarded through the Historical Resource Development Program, funded through the state's Resource Enhancement and Protection (REAP) program, plus a dozen grants for individual research projects.

The funded projects run the gamut. This year's grants will help Iowans:

- Continue repairs at the historic Madison County Courthouse (pictured above).
- Preserve and digitize Bix Beiderbecke's printed materials and jazz recordings in Davenport.
- Learn more about Iowa's Black military veterans and the communities they built after their service.
- Digitize interviews with Amana Colony members who recounted memories of communal living.
- Preserve approximately 170,000 historic specimens of plants and fungi at Iowa State University.
- And so much more.




History On a Stick*
