Virtual Arts Experience Grants

The Iowa Arts Council is pleased to announce the first round of Virtual Arts Experience Grants, funded in part through appropriations from the National Endowment for the Arts. In all, more than \$54,000 was awarded to seven nonprofit organizations and one school, including:

- **Grundy Center Elementary School**, which will hire artist Dale Santoiemma of Waverly to virtually teach cartooning skills to 265 students from kindergarten to fourth grade.
- **City Voices** in Des Moines, which is teaming up with Des Moines Public Schools to launch an online course to help students and aspiring actors build skills that will aid them in auditioning for college and pursuing careers in musical theater.
- **Eastern Iowa Arts Academy** in Cedar Rapids, which will present virtual art classes for high school students in the autism program at Washington High School.

The Iowa Arts Council launched the Virtual Arts Experience Grants program earlier this year in lieu of its regular grants for field trips and other in-school arts programs. It's designed to help arts organizations and educators develop creative ways to reach students and adults in an online learning environment.

Virtual Arts Experience Grant recipients will also have access to a related professional-development opportunity, commissioned by the Iowa Arts Council and developed by Yen Verhoeven of the Qi Learning Research Group. This multi-part training, which is also supported by Bravo Greater Des Moines, will help educators create innovative online arts resources and navigate multiple modes of instruction.
