Air Quality permits under review

DES MOINES – The DNR Air Quality Bureau has the following draft permits up for review. The permits help protect lowans' health and air quality. DNR's permitting staff review each permit application to ensure facilities comply with state and federal air quality requirements. We encourage public comments on draft permits, providing help on how to make-effective comments. Submit written comments to the assigned permit writer before 4:30 p.m. on the last day of the comment period. DNR considers public comments before finalizing the permits.

Title V Operating Permits

Title V Operating permits are reviewed and re-issued every five years. Facilities with a Title V permit have the potential to emit large amounts of air pollutants compared to other facilities. The five-year reviews are a federal requirement and ensure adequate monitoring is included in the permit. The DNR plans to issue Title V Operating Permits for the following facilities. Louisa County

Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America – Station 199 located at 2482 Jasper Avenue, Letts. The application was submitted to operate their existing Natural Gas Transmission facility. The public comment period ends Feb. 6.

Muscatine County

Muscatine Power & Water located at 1700 Dick Drake Way, Muscatine.

The application was submitted to operate their existing Electric Services facility. The public comment period ends Feb. 6.

Worth County

POET Biorefining – Hanlontown located at 3638 Fir Avenue, Hanlontown. The application was submitted to operate their existing Industrial Organic Chemicals, NEC facility. The public comment period ends Feb. 6.
