Free Technical Assistance for Green Infrastructure offered by National Municipal Stormwater Alliance

The National Municipal Stormwater Alliance (NMSA) is offering free technical resources to a limited number of communities who are interested in utilizing the Community-Based Public-Private Partnership (CBP3) program approach to implement large scale green infrastructure at a significant cost savings for reducing stormwater runoff, localized flooding, and making green economic improvements to their communities. The deadline for applying for CBP3 assistance is February 10, 2021. All work will occur between that time and April 15, 2021. Eligibility:

Only public sector/municipal staff can seek technical assistance. It is anticipated that between 3 and 5 communities will be selected with a variance in geography, size/scale of community, and overall community profile in terms of environmental, social, and economic challenges/needs.

Type of Assistance Offered:

Assistance will take the form of expertise and technical support and will include background research and remote engagement with key municipal department staff to gain knowledge on community issues such as stormwater management program needs, business development efforts, affordable housing, infrastructure funding/financing, economic development, and other environmental and/or infrastructure challenges and needs.

Background:

The CBP3 program approach was developed by the U.S. EPA to help communities accelerate environmental infrastructure investments – especially distributed infrastructure types such as green stormwater infrastructure – in a more efficient and

cost-effective manner through project bundling, fixed-fee infrastructure implementation, and efficient project delivery approaches.
