Springboard for the Arts is offering a new fellowship to help creative rural leaders in the upper Midwest strengthen their communities through art and culture. In all, **10 fellows will be chosen for the Rural Regenerator Fellowship program** based on their commitment to rural arts-based community development, their interest in sharing their experiences with other fellows, and their desire to grow, adapt or launch new community-focused work. **Each fellow will receive \$10,000 in flexible funds** to support existing work and/or to launch a new local project.

Applications for the Rural Regenerator Fellowship are due by June 11, with an information session on May 21.

National Endowment for the Arts

Congratulations to **Red Cedar Chamber Music** and the **Des Moines Metro Opera**, who were among more than 1,100 arts organizations awarded grants by the National Endowment for the Arts this week! Per the same announcement, the Iowa Arts Council received a state partnership award of \$709,635 for its next fiscal year starting July 1, 2021. This represents an increase from 2020, which strengthens the IAC's ability to support Iowa arts and culture.

Current NEA Funding Opportunities

Iowa arts organizations are highly encouraged to apply for upcoming NEA funding opportunities:

~ **Creative Forces Research Funding**: Up to four sub-awards for feasibility/pilot studies: Art Therapy Research with Military Populations, and Music Therapy Research with Military Populations. **Application deadline: June 16.**

~ **Grants for Arts Projects**: These grants support arts projects that unite and heal in response to current events; celebrate creativity and cultural heritage; invite mutual respect for differing beliefs and values; and enrich humanity. **Application deadline: July 8.**

~ **Our Town**: Grants for creative placemaking projects. Guidelines will be posted in May 2021. **Application deadline: Aug. 5**

The application process for a federal grant includes several steps. Applicants are encouraged to start the process early and to review the application calendar for program deadlines. [**IAC staff are here to assist you with any questions**](#) about the process of applying for federal grants.

National Endowment for the Humanities

The National Endowment for the Humanities [**recently designated**](#) the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs as its interim state humanities partner. In its new role, the department will work with constituents throughout 2021 to serve and strengthen the humanities and culture throughout the state. The department will seek input from Iowa's humanities sector and national peer groups to develop programs that meet Iowans' current needs. New programs will be announced when the initial public input process finishes at the end of 2021. Additionally, the department expects to launch new Humanities Project Grants in August.
