Early Bird Registration Opens in July

Look ahead to July 7 when Early Bird Registration opens for the 2021 Conference of the Association for Rural & Small Libraries (ARSL) This year's theme is *The Biggest Little Library Conference*. From the event website: "Our libraries may be small, but our community is mighty. As we come together to share ideas and learn from each other in Reno, the "Biggest Little City," the possibilities are huge."

This year's conference is scheduled for **October 20-23, 2021** on-site in Sparks, Nevada, a suburb just outside of Reno. For those who can't make the trip, there will also be a virtual component. Those who take advantage of the **Early Bird registration** receive a significant discount; **early registration opens on July 7 and closes on August 17**.

In-Person Registration Costs

- ARSL Members: Early Bird \$275 | After \$350
- Nonmembers: Early Bird \$350 | After \$425
- Advocates: Early Bird \$225 | After \$275 (advocates includes library board members, Friends Group members, and volunteers)

Virtual Access Registration Costs



Adult Programming Opportunity

ARPA Grant Update

Apply Soon--Two Weeks Remaining

At this writing, the State Library has received 150 applications for ARPA grants. With two weeks remaining, Iowa public libraries meeting standards at a least a Tier 1 level are encouraged to apply for a grant up to \$5,000.00. **Application deadline is July 2nd.**

Project priorities include materials or technology to support digital inclusion efforts, enabling libraries to support education, community health and wellness projects, or



workforce development needs. Grants can also be used as a continued response to the pandemic and to implement public health protocols.

This funding is provided to the State Library through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) administered by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) These are non-competitive grants and will be handled as a reimbursement; meaning that library-city budgets will need to pay for any of the allowable purchases and the ARPA

grant funding will then provide reimbursement.

<u>Please Note:</u> If you've submitted a grant application, but haven't heard back yet, please check your email spam / junk folders. Project managers have been able to keep to a quick turn-around time for approving applications. Once approved, you will receive back an **Award Letter** and a **Letter of Agreement**. We have found that this email is landing in spam folders, this has happened to several libraries, so please check that possibility first before calling.
