We'll be joined at both by Shreya Khullar, Iowa's first Student Poet Ambassador. Khullar is a student at West High School in Iowa City and was named the state's first Student Poet Ambassador in a ceremony at the Capitol in May. Khullar will join the virtual visits as a special guest in conversation with each author and State Library Youth Services Consultant Angie Manfredi. 
