# **Legislative Update**

We would like to welcome <u>Senator Jeff Danielson</u> of Cedar Falls to the Commission for the Iowa Department of Elder Affairs (DEA). Senator Danielson will replace Senator Joe Bolkcom as the Senate Democrat on the Elder Affairs Commission. The department has already been in contact with Senator Danielson and we look forward to working closely with him. Senator Bolkcom of Iowa City, has been and continues to be a tireless advocate for older adults. While Senator Bolkcom will no longer be a member of the Commission, he has let it be known that he is still an enthusiastic advocate for older Iowans and continues to be a resource for them. Our thanks to Senator Bolkcom for the many years he has served on the department's commission. Senator Bolkcom's efforts have been and continue to make Iowa a healthy, safe and productive place for older Iowans to live and work.

The number of sub-committee meetings is beginning to pick up as the first funnel date (March  $11^{\text{th}}$ ) is three weeks away. The department's bill related to the Medical Assistance Advisory Council (MAAC) moved out of sub-committee in the senate this week (<u>SSB 1042</u>) and will now move to the full <u>Senate Human Resources standing</u> <u>committee</u>. The department's technical bill (<u>HSB 157</u>) has also moved out of sub-committee and will now move to the full <u>House</u> <u>Human Resources standing committee</u>. Two bills on dependent adult abuse (<u>HF 156</u> and <u>HF 157</u>) have likely met an early death in sub-committee. However, other bills related to dependent adult abuse are pending, including a department bill and a bill submitted by the Department of Inspections and Appeals (DIA). Also note that another version of the Universal Assessment language has been introduced into the Senate as <u>SF 159</u>.

**Monday:** Director Mark Haverland (DEA) updated the Senate Human Resource standing committee on the issues related to rebalancing long-term care in Iowa. His presentation will be posted to the Elder Affairs website under *What's New* and titled, "*Long Term Care in Iowa, A Basic Right*" early next week.

**Tuesday:** Senate Democrats held a press conference and introduced a five-part plan for improving access to health care and lowering the cost of health care in the state. Senator Ragan stated these are "commonsense ideas that have widespread support in the health care community." The five parts are:

- Fully fund Medicaid
- Expand insurance options for small businesses
- *Require coverage for mental health and substance abuse*
- Expand access to the Hawk-I program
- Funding of Community Health Centers.

The House Human Resources standing committee provided the opportunity for both consumers and providers to help legislators better understand the impact of regulation in the assisted living environment. Representatives from DIA and DEA, along with legislators and industry representatives discussed a number of issues that will likely be considered as the Departments' bill relating to policy in assisted living environments (HSB 95) is again considered by the General Assembly.

**Wednesday:** The house and human resource committees did not meet on Wednesday. Jennifer Vermeer, of the Legislative Services Agency, presented an overview of the Medical Assistance Crises Intervention Team (MACIT) during the <u>Joint Appropriations Health</u> and Human Services sub-committee.

Lisa Burk, also of the Legislative Service Agency, presented projections for the Senior Living Trust Fund.

**Thursday:** <u>HSB 161</u> pertaining to the long-term care asset disregard incentive program passed out of sub-committee and now moves to the full House Human Resources standing committee.

Director Kevin Concannon (DHS) discussed at length issues related to the proposed universal assessment in the joint appropriations subcommittee. This proposal would grandfather in all current residents in nursing facilities and would not apply until July 1, 2006. Director Concannon discussed the need to build the capacity of the home and community based service delivery system, particularly adult day service programs. The joint appropriations committee had a discussion related to existing regulations. Director Concannon was asked to provide additional information related to regulatory barriers to home and community based services. Jennifer Vermeer, of the Legislative Service Agency, also provided information on Medicare Part D.

The House Human Resources Standing Committee discussed the issues related to mental health parity. <u>HSB 117</u> was passed by the committee and now moves to the full house.

### A Few Things About Next Week:

- On February 22<sup>nd</sup>, there will be a presentation in both the House and Senate Human Resource Standing Committees regarding the Program of All-inclusive Care for Seniors (PACE).
- The department's proposed legislation regarding establishing an office of substitute decision making (<u>HSB 96</u> and <u>HF 120</u>) is scheduled for sub-committee on February  $23^{rd}$  at 9:00 a.m. in the house lounge. It is likely this bill (<u>SSB 1078</u>) will also be discussed in Senate sub-committee.
- The department's proposed legislation related to assisted living will likely be discussed in subcommittee. No date or location is yet available.
- <u>HSB 100</u> related to the membership of the Medical Assistance Advisory Committee will be discussed at 11:30 a.m. on February 23<sup>rd</sup> in the house lounge. This bill is the same as <u>SSB 1042</u>, which passed a Senate sub-committee last week.

Family caregivers care for family members with a broad range of conditions. Caregivers commit to caring for loved ones with conditions that may be very temporary, last a few years, or last a lifetime. The age of the person being cared for could be young, or old, or anywhere in between. The common link for all caregivers is that they experience stress, changing family dynamics, isolation, frustration and loss of personal time. In recognition of the importance of providing resources to family caregivers to relieve these burdens, the Department of Elder Affairs participates in the Iowa Family Caregiver Program.

The program receives operational funding from federal dollars distributed to Iowa by the Administration on Aging and the Iowa Department of Elder Affairs. The program's purpose is to assist persons who are caregivers of an older adult, or for persons age 60 and older who are full time caregivers of a child or children. The Iowa Family Caregiver Program is a joint venture of the Iowa Association of Area Agencies on Aging, the Department of Elder Affairs, consumer organizations, and community services providers.
