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Training in Using HelpNow From Brainfuse



Webinars For Frontline Library Staff

Last week came the announcement that the State Library is providing another online resource for Iowa's public libraries. **HelpNow from Brainfuse** is a homework assistance and tutoring service. The State Library has recently signed a three-year contract; we expect the rollout to begin soon as the service is made available to the state's public libraries.

HelpNow will be available at no cost to public libraries for the first year, paid by the State Library through American Rescue Plan Act funding (ARPA) Libraries that currently subscribe to **HelpNow** will receive a pro-rated refund from Brainfuse for the amount remaining on their contract. Through an easy-to-use online classroom, **HelpNow** offers patrons of all ages state-aligned one-to-one tutoring, intensive writing assistance, targeted skill building, test preparation, an adult learning center, a full line of collaborative learning and self-study tools, and much more.

Front Line Staff Training

From Brainfuse, *Frontline Staff Training in HelpNow* will cover all features available to patrons of Iowa libraries. This includes live tutoring services; asynchronous tutoring features such as the Writing Lab and Send Question Center; the Skill Surfer online content library; and other academic, interactive tools to assist users with their learning needs. Brainfuse trainers will also demonstrate account features available to patrons

who elect to register an optional, free Brainfuse **HelpNow** account when accessing the services. Time will be allotted at the end of the demonstration for audience questions.

At the end of this webinar, library staff will feel equipped to talk about **Brainfuse HelpNow** with their patrons, support learners using **HelpNow**, and know who to contact if they don't know an answer to specific questions. There are five days and various time slots to choose from, all of which are found in IALearns.

Brainfuse customer support has begun sending each library a unique **HelpNow** URL to be added as a link to the library's website. The email will include instructions and a link to promotional materials to help debut **HelpNow** to students and parents alike.

Update: Learning Circuit 2021

Now An All-Virtual Event September 30th

Last week came an announcement about the **State Library Learning Circuit** next month. Scheduled for **September 30**, the **Learning Circuit** will be an all-virtual event this year. We had hoped to host a hybrid event, combining a keynote speaker via ZOOM in the morning with an in-person workshop at six locations in the afternoon. But given the ongoing and evolving situation



surrounding the COVID Delta variant, we felt we needed to reconsider that decision and present the entire day online.

Customer Service Is The Topic

Customer service remains the focus, beginning with the keynote presentation by Bryce Kozla speaking on the six principles of trauma-informed care. The afternoon portion will

include a guided discussion aimed at putting the library staff in the patrons' shoes, designing positive customer experiences in any size library.

Continuing Education Consultant Samantha Bouwers has more: *"Trauma-Informed Care started in the healthcare field, but there is a lot to being trauma-informed that can equip libraries to best serve our complex communities. A trauma-informed library is a place where the perspectives of people who have experienced trauma are honored, and one that provides positive spaces, services, and work culture."*

Flipping to All-Virtual

Our decision to flip to an all-virtual day wasn't made lightly. Sam Bouwers explained to everyone who had already pre-registered: "we recognize that while this might be a relief for some people, it will also be a frustration for others. As eager as we are to get back together again for in-person workshops, the health and safety of the community we serve has to take top priority. We only hope that come next month, it will look like we made an overly cautious decision. So we do hope you can join us virtually, we're excited about the topic, and we're confident that libraries will benefit from what we have planned..."
