China recently inaugurated its national carbon market, a landmark practice that experts said will not only help accelerate the reduction in domestic carbon emissions, but also promote a broader global response to climate change. - Read More

China floods: Damage to livestock industry tops US\$348 million

The deadly floods in the central province of Henan resulted in economic losses of 2.25 billion yuan (US\$348 million) for China's poultry and livestock industries after 248,000 pigs and 6.4 million chickens died. The floods, which have been described as the worst in decades after killing at least 99 people, saw some 15,000 farms affected, while another 45,000 sheep and other large livestock also died, according to China's Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs. – Read More

China boosts supply of seeds to help flood-hit province

China is working to ensure the supply of seeds for agricultural recovery in Central China's Henan province, where the torrential rainfall caused casualties and property losses. Enterprises in Henan have been active and can provide seeds which are expected to cover 3.36 million mu (224,000 hectares) of land, said the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs on July 27. – Read More

China will improve management of central fiscal research expenditure to give researchers more say in fund use, said a State Council executive meeting held on July 28. The meeting, chaired by Premier Li Keqiang, also specified measures to keep hog production capacity stable to ensure the safe supply of pork and stabilize the prices. – Read More

Income of China's rural residents up 14.1% in H1

The per capita disposable income of China's rural residents reached 9,248 yuan (about \$1,426) in the first half of the year, up 14.1 percent year-on-year in real terms after deducting price factors, an official said earlier. The pace of growth of rural residents' income is 3.4 percentage points faster than that of urban residents, Zeng Yande, a senior official with the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs, told a press conference. – Read More

Officials work to ensure food supply after floods damage crops

China's agriculture authority is ramping up efforts to ensure ample food supply in China amid extreme weather conditions this year that have posed challenges to the nation's food production in some areas, according to the Ministry of Agricultural and Rural Affairs. Pan Wenbo, head of the ministry's plantation department, said 100 million yuan (\$15.5 million) has been allocated from the national budget to support the recovery of agricultural production in Henan province, which was recently battered by torrential rainfall and inundated by floods. — Read More

National Pilot Zone to develop premium wine in Ningxia launched

Ningxia National Open Development Comprehensive Pilot Zone for Grape and Wine Industry was inaugurated on July 10, 2021, in Yinchuan, Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region. Vice Minister Ma Youxiang addressed the ceremony. The Pilot Zone is to be developed jointly by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs (MARA), the Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT) and the People's Government of Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region (NHAR). — Read More

China will finish the protection of 6.67 million hectares of black soil during the 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-25) period, improving the quality of farming and increasing organic matter in the soil by 10 percent, according to a plan released recently by the Ministry of Agricultural and Rural Affairs and six other departments. – Read More
