### Fall 2017 Update

# Status of Data Collection & Reporting

- For CY2016, there are 619 cases entered in the database. This is the first year we captured data on violent deaths across the whole state. Of them, death certificate data is 96% complete; ME records are 90% complete, and LE records are 37% complete.
- There are 503 cases identified for CY2017 deaths to date.
- Death certificate data is uploaded monthly from IDPH Vital Records, and we receive ME records electronically from the IOSME usually within 1-2 months of the death. Early in 2018, we expect to receive ME records directly from Polk Co. ME and Johnson Co. ME for the cases they autopsy and investigate.
- At the October Advisory Committee meeting, we presented some data on undetermined deaths (2015-2017; n=98). Of those with known substance information, the top five substances included:
  - o anti-depressants (34.7%)
  - o benzodiazepines (32.9%)
  - o opiates (31.2%)
  - o amphetamines (24.1%)
  - o alcohol (24.0%)

Some of these deaths included more than one substance.
