There's a new name and a new logo for a long-standing conference sponsored by the State Library. The new name is **lowa Libraries Online Conference**—ILOC for short. But

Every January since 2008, lowa library staff and boards have logged into the State Library's all-day online conference. It's a great way to stay connected over the winter months, as travel becomes unpredictable. Plus, logging into a virtual conference in cold, snowy January holds lots of warm appeal.



<u>ILOC</u> started as a virtual conference, initially designed for the needs of small libraries in mind. Today libraries of all sizes find value in the programming line-up and are able to scale up or scale down the ideas presented. And that's more easily done because this virtual conference is designed and presented by lowa librarians. Plus there is typically an evening program designed for library trustees.


