

**CMS Launches New Tool** 

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is making it easier to check COVID-19 vaccination rates for nursing home staff and residents with a new feature on Medicare.gov.

"CMS wants to empower nursing home residents, their families and caregivers with the information they need when choosing care providers for their loved ones. As we continue to work with our partners to monitor the spread of COVID-19 and keep nursing home residents safe, we want to give people a new tool to visualize this data to help them make informed decisions," said CMS Administrator Chiquita Brooks-LaSure. "CMS knows that nursing home staff want to protect their residents and is calling on them to get vaccinated now. The COVID-19 vaccine is safe, effective and accessible to all at no out-of-pocket cost."

#### Low Income Home Modification Funding Available in IA

The City of Dubuque and the East Central Intergovernmental Association were each awarded \$1.0 million in funding from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development to support aging in place home modifications for low income seniors. The grant allows lowans aged 60+ with limited income to stay in their homes through low-cost home modifications that will reduce older adults' risk of falling. Examples of these home modifications include installation of grab bars, railings, and lever-handle door knobs and faucets, as well as the installation of adaptive equipment, such as non-slip strips for tub/shower or stairs. These investments will enable older adults to remain in their homes – to "age in place" – rather than move to nursing homes or other assisted care facilities.

The programs are in a "pre-application" stage gathering a list of seniors interested in receiving the service. To learn more, go to to either:
