Fall Prevention Program Reached 85K Older Adults



Senior Employment

Sharp rises in the job numbers signal economic recovery for people with and without disabilities, according to National Trends in Disability Employment – Monthly Update (nTIDE), issued by Kessler Foundation and the University of New Hampshire's Institute on Disability (UNH-IOD). Key indicators are closing in on pre-pandemic levels as people with disabilities strengthen their position in the labor market.
