Transition:

Confirmation of Coverage

Members will receive a Confirmation of Coverage Letterover the next several weeks. This letter will include the Managed Care Organization (MCO) they're enrolled with, whether they actively made a selection or kept their assignment.

If a member does not know which MCO they were assigned, they can call Member Services at 1-800-338-8366. If a member is not happy with their assignment or choice, they may change their plan until May 18, 2016 for any reason, and after that for "Good Cause" reasons.

Contracting Continues

Providers are encouraged to continue working with the three managed care organizations (MCOs) to complete contracts and credentialing requirements in time for the anticipated March 1, 2016, launch date. Find the <u>MCO contacts here</u>.

lowa providers have signed more than 95,000 contracts with the MCOs. Each plan has enrolled over 88 percent of the currently active Fee-for-Service lowa providers in their network. Nearly 60 percent of current providers have signed with all 3 MCOs.

Managed Care Improves Quality and Access

Robert Damler, a consulting actuary with Milliman, Inc., testified Tuesday before the Health and Human Services Appropriations Subcommittee. He said states that move to Medicaid managed care can improve quality and access for patients.

In New York, he said, Medicaid performance results matched or exceeded commercial results. Medicaid managed care gave better access to primary care, prescription drugs and disability services as rated by California Medicaid patients. His presentation can be found <u>here</u>.

Prior Authorization Process Clarification

Informational Letter 1591-MC directed providers on the Prior Authorization (PA) process for the IA Health Link program. Further clarification on this process for both pharmacy drugs that require a PA, and all other services requiring a PA, can be found in Informational Letter 1607-MC.

PAs are used by the Iowa Medicaid Enterprise (IME) to ensure program integrity, by requiring that all services are medically necessary. The MCOs will honor existing IME PAs for 90 days for all services and providers.

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
