November 16. JobNow/VetNow Webinar, 10:30-11:30AM

In addition to all of the classes noted in the first article, there are also two PLOW Website Worktime sessions this week.

PLOW Website Worktime. Wednesday November 17. 2:00-3:00PM. REPEATS Friday November 19. 10:00-11:00AM

This one-hour website worktime features different elements of the new PLOW website Concrete 5, with instruction on how to improve the website appearance. Participants can simply watch or log onto their own website to follow along. Participants can bring questions or problems to the class which will be addressed during the allotted time. Sessions will be recorded.

By the end of the PLOW training session, participants will be able to (1) complete the task on their own website (2) discover new techniques, new content, and new ideas to improve their website (3) overcome problems related to their own website that was preventing them from adding content. Agenda: Administrative, Dashboard and Sitemap, Header and Footer, Images, Calendar and Events, File Manager, Forms, New Pages, and Tabs
