

Iowa Care Center Uses Grant-Built Lab to Train Certified Nursing Assistants



Bridget Hanner walked into the Pleasant View Care Center in Whiting last year hoping that they would pay her to wash dishes or fold laundry. Instead, she suddenly found herself on a path to a new health care career.

Hanner, a lifelong resident of northwest Iowa, had a large gap in her resume after quitting work 26 years ago to raise a daughter and care for ailing parents. But Katherine Keane, Pleasant View Care Center's administrator, thought Hanner's caring nature would fit well in the center's new apprenticeship program.

Last fall, Hanner became a Certified Nursing Assistant – one of roughly 50 people who keep Pleasant View running by handling duties such as gathering medical supplies and grooming or moving patients. She's also an example of the powerful tools that many health care organizations are now using to fill needed positions.

New Grants Awarded: \$2.26M for Summer Youth Internships

lowa Gov. Kim Reynolds this week awarded nearly \$2.26 million to 35 projects designed to help lowa youth gain access to meaningful work experience while exploring and preparing for high-demand careers.

This is the fourth consecutive year that the state is awarding Future Ready Iowa's Summer Youth Internship Program grants. The grants will directly support efforts to increase the career

lowa job seekers now have access to a valuable professional training program that's designed to prepare participants for high-growth technology jobs in less than six months.

In March, Iowa WORKS offices throughout the state began offering access to Grow with Google training certificates at no cost to Iowans through Google's Career Certificates Scholarship Program.

IowaWORKS offices are receiving no-cost access to the program through a partnership between the National Association of State Workforce Agencies opportunities available for lowa's youth, including in areas with atrisk or under-represented communities.

Across Iowa, the grants will fund internships for an estimated 659 students from 85 communities.

(NASWA) and Grow with Google. Grow with Google is making 30,000 program scholarships available nationwide. Through the program, participants can earn certificates in the fields of data analytics, IT support, project management, user experience design and/or Python.

Classes will be offered through

the <u>Coursera.org</u> learning platform and are intended to provide another tool that will enhance, but not replace, existing lowa training programs. Certificates and scholarship opportunities will be particularly focused toward low-income adults, Veterans and their spouses, and participants in IWD's Reemployment Case Management (RCM) program. Career Planners will work with individuals directly and conduct a short assessment to ensure they are prepared before they are enrolled in the program.


Video: Grant Creates New Possibilities for Des Moines Child Care Center


RCM By the Numbers



lowa Workforce Development launched its Reemployment Case Management system earlier this year to add a new sense of urgency to getting unemployed lowans back into the workforce. The new program provides most unemployment claimants with weekly assistance from an IWD Career Planner to help them assess their skills and match those skills with in-demand jobs.

IWD career planners have had more than 6,000 meetings with clients since the program started, while more than 1,100 claimants have left unemployment for new careers. Click here for more information about RCM.

Despite the fact that demand for workers has never been higher, Christian Gray still believes that there's plenty of untapped potential out there – people who lowa employers never meet, because they only interview people who apply for jobs bearing two- or four-year degrees.
