New Directors

The last couple of years have been tough on library directors and library staff! Added to pandemic issues, historically, lowa library directors in small (and medium!) towns have been terribly underpaid and undervalued. They are also rarely offered full time employment and benefits. This means statewide we sometimes have a revolving door of new directors and this holds true in the Southeast District. Part of my job is to welcome new directors to the state and provide my expertise in walking new staff through State Library programs and services. One way I do that is by meeting with a new director within their first few months on the job. I love being on the road again and meeting everyone, but the number of new directors has been huge lately! In just the Southeast District, which encompasses 92 libraries, I met with 13 new directors in 2020, 20 in 2021 and so far this year, we are at 9 new directors. This means we will likely have turned over on half of the library directors in less than three years!

All this is to say, please welcome new directors in your area! Make sure they know the county organizations they can be part of, provide support for them as they learn their way through a new job and make sure they know I am here for answers!
