Introduction


Iowa's 13 Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for tracking and reporting on services provided to aging citizens of Iowa funded through Federal and State programs. After collecting detailed information on the services provided, the recipients of the services, the providers of the services, and the associated costs, DEA is responsible for filing an annual State Performance Report (SPR) with the Administration of Aging and an Iowa Senior Living Program Report. There were a total of **108,879** unduplicated clients reported to INAPIS.

This report shows the number of older Iowans and units of service by service category from Title III funding of the Older Americans Act, through the Administration on Aging (AoA), the Iowa Senior Living Trust Fund and limited state general fund dollars.

DEA hopes that this document and the information contained within can be a useful tool for making informed planning decisions. The information provided in this report is the result of hard work and dedication from the Iowa Aging Network who work as a team with the Iowa Department of Elder Affairs toward its mission: "To provide advocacy, educational, and prevention services to older Iowans so they can find Iowa a healthy, safe, productive, and enjoyable place to live and work.

INAPIS Data

INAPIS data is reported to DEA from AAAs and this report represents information about consumers and services provided from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006. INAPIS data is dynamic and any corrections by the AAA at the local level after August 15, 2006 would not be reflected in this report.

The following definitions will assist you in using this document:

General Aging Program: Elderly persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through Title III funding of the Older Americans Act, the Administration on Aging (AoA and other funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Senior Living Program (SLP): Elderly persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through the Senior Living Trust Fund.

Family Care Giver: Persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through the Title III-E Family Caregiver Program and other funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Clients: Eligible persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through public funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Services: A form of benefit received by the client; service can be recorded by individual clients or aggregate clients (tracks service delivery to a number of nonspecific clients); service tracking can include but is not limited to: Title III services defined by Administration on Aging (AoA); Senior Living Trust Funding (SLP services); and Title III-E Caregiver services.

Registered Service: Services that require a NAPIS client registration containing a "detailed" profile of client characteristics that include:

- Minority status, by individual minority group
- Age group
- ADL/IADL status
- Sex
- Rural status
- Live alone status
- Poverty status

DEA encourages client registration for all services but requires client registration for 9 of the 14 AOA core services that include:

- Personal Care
- Homemaker
- Chore
- Home Delivered Meals
- Day Care/Adult Day Health
- Case Management
- Congregate Meals
- Nutrition Counseling
- Assisted Transportation

and all services funded through the Senior Living Trust Fund and Title III funds designated by DEA as a required registered service with the exception of Legal Services.

Note: Based on Federal Guidelines services cannot be denied to a client who refuses to complete a client registration for General Aging and Family Caregiver programs.

Aggregate Service: Services that do not require a NAPIS client registration containing a "detailed" profile of client characteristics and are entered as an aggregate total of clients that received a service.

Service Unit: Description of how the service is delivered and recorded into the NAPIS system (i.e. hour, contact, session).



81% of all High Nutrition Risk clients reported improvement or no change in their Nutrition Risk Score.



Congregate Meals reported the highest number of unduplicated clients for SFY06 at 77,374 followed by Home Delivered Meals at 15,822 and Case Management at 13,629.


For services with significant numbers, the largest increase of unduplicated clients in SFY06 was Case Management with 1,543 clients. The largest % increase in clients was Outreach at 55%.

For services with significant numbers, the largest % decrease of unduplicated clients in SFY06 was Assisted Transportation with 1,543 (-14%) followed by Personal Care with 391 (-13%) and Nutrition Education 2,556 (-12%).

SFY 2006 Unduplicated Client Counts for Services and Programs


Chart 3: Unduplicated Client Count for 14 Core Services by Funding Program


Chart 4: Unduplicated Client Count for Non-Core Services

Material Aid (2,046) had the highest number of unduplicated clients among non-core services followed by Emergency Response (1,409) and Assessment & Intervention (1,208)











N=1,734










Chart 13: Unduplicated Clients by Income Level & % of Total Clients






SFY 2006 Client Characteristics- Age Group & Urban / Rural Status




SFY 2006 Client Characteristics- Age Group & Living Alone Status

















N = 330





Chart 29: Home Delivered Meal Clients Nutrition Score Outcome
