FY08 HSGP Application Deadline Extended

The deadline for interested parties to submit applications for FY08 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) funding has been extended to February 14.

After considering input from a variety of homeland security partners, the Iowa Homeland Security and Emergency Management Division (HSEMD) has granted an extension of the due date for applications for inclusion in the FY08 Investment Justification. The Investment Justification is the mechanism through which states request funding and within it must describe specific funding and implementation approaches.

The extension was granted to allow for the additional coordination and collaboration applicants said they needed in order to submit quality, well-thoughtout packages.

Public Assistance Deadline Nears

As of January 18, 185 Request for Public Assistance (RPAs) forms have been submitted for the December ice storm. These initial RPA forms are a preliminary indication that a jurisdiction is interested in requesting Public As-

sistance funds. There is no obligation and it is understood that jurisdictions won't know potential projects and costs until further along in the process.

RPAs are due 30 days after the Presidential Declaration is made, so the deadline for Disaster 1737 is February 3. The forms are available on the HSEMD Web site. Click on the December 10, 2007 Ice Storm header on the front page.

cers will begin gearing up and visiting the 30 counties declared under this disaster starting on Tuesday January 22. The preliminary damage estimates for eligible PA costs were set at \$16.5 million. A better damage estimate will be made in the next weeks as projects and damages are more fully identified.

2008 Legislative Session Convenes

The 2008 session of the Iowa General Assembly kicked off on January 14. According to HSEMD legislative liaison John Benson, it looks to be an interesting session.

With this being the second year of a two year session, bills that did not meet deadlines for consideration last year can be reintroduced this year. We have seen several bills from last year regaining life already this year.

Two bills from last year that have been reintroduced are House File (HF) 689 and HF 247. HF 689 would allow the local emergency management commission to impose a county wide levy as one of its authorized methods of funding its budget. The bill is presently in a subcommittee of the House Local Government Committee made up of Representatives Olson, Frevert, and Windschitl. HF 247 seeks to amend the E911 service board membership language found in *Code of Iowa* Chapter 34A. It passed out of the Local Government Committee on January 16 and is headed for the floor of the House for debate.

We also saw new bills introduced during the first week. HF 2022 deals with roads that are closed during inclement weather and specifies that it would be a misdemeanor for unauthorized vehicles to be

on a closed road. Benson said he expects that as we move through the session, we will see more bills introduced that could have an impact on homeland security and emergency management.

HSEMD intends to have a fairly quiet session, with our main focus being working through the appropriation process to ensure our funding remains level in accordance with the Governor's wishes. Of course, we will work on any issues for which the Legislature seeks our guidance.

National Information Sharing Network Upgraded

The Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) is a counterterrorism communications system used by all 50 states, including Iowa. Recently, national media outlets have incorrectly reported the HSIN is being dismantled. These reports are incorrect. HSIN is simply being upgraded to improve user access and value.

The efforts to develop a next generation of HSIN is not a dramatic departure from the current version of HSIN, rather this effort is intended to improve overall information sharing capabilities. The current HSIN platform is several years old while commercial technology has continued to improve. The current activities are part of the planned evolution of HSIN. The HSIN portals HSEMD uses will remain in place and the transition to the new HSIN should be seamless for most users.

During HSIN system upgrade, lowa's secure information sharing portals will remain operational. We do not anticipate disruptions or loss of content or capabilities. If you have any problems with HSIN access, please contact the help desk at 1-866-430-0162 or <u>HSIN.Helpdesk@dhs.gov</u>.

Eighty-eight Counties Apply for EMPG

Eighty-eight counties met the January 18 deadline for submission of applications for 2008 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) funding to HSEMD.

Although HSEMD staff will complete review of the applications by February 20, at this time we do not know when the allocation will be announced by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS). In the past, once states were notified of their allocations, there was a 45-day application period. Following that, DHS took 30-40 days to review the applications before they sent a Notice of Award. So it could be the end of March before HSEMD releases EMPG funds.
