# **Iowa Finance Authority**

#### • The Roosevelt, Cedar Rapids

- Approved a grant of up to \$5 million to refurbish The Roosevelt, a multi-family housing property located at 200 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, N.E. in Cedar Rapids.
- Officials expect The Roosevelt to reopen sometime in late summer 2009 after substantial renovations including:
  - Replacement of electrical service components and systems in the basement
  - Replacement of mechanical systems in the basement
  - Elevator repairs
  - Complete demolition of first floor walls and ceilings
  - Complete demolition of the basement
  - Reconstruction of first floor common areas and electrical space.
- Upon reopening, The Roosevelt will consist of 97 units, including four efficiencies, 50 onebedroom units and 34 two-bedroom units. Eighty-three of the units will be available for individuals or families who earn 60 percent of the area median income or less.
- Commercial tenants will occupy the building's first floor.

# <u>Iowa State University Center for Industrial Research and Service (CIRAS)</u>

- CIRAS teams have met with six manufacturers and are addressing challenges and offering solutions
  to assist in achieving pre-disaster production levels. Examples of assistance include facility layout,
  materials testing and learning how to conduct business with federal, state and local agencies along
  with identifying current and future procurement opportunities for lowa businesses.

# **Rebuild Iowa Office (RIO)**

#### Declarations

- August 7, 2008 Governor Chet Culver announced that four additional Iowa counties –
   Appanoose, Clark, Monroe, and Ringgold were granted a Presidential Disaster Declaration for Individual Assistance and Clark and Wayne counties were granted Public Assistance.
- o 82 counties have been approved for Public Assistance.
- o 67 counties have been approved for Individual Assistance.

# • Cedar Rapids Debris Removal Assistance

- Governor Culver and FEMA announced that the Cedar Rapids will receive more than \$1.1 million for removal of debris.
- o Removal of "catastrophic amounts of debris" from Cedar Rapids began on June 20 and the first pass was completed on July 3. During that time 16,330 tons of ruined household goods and furnishings, damaged construction materials, vegetative debris, business, industrial, and hazardous waste, household chemicals, appliances, and the like were collected and hauled to final disposal areas.

# **U.S. Small Business Administration**

- Staffing 3 fixed Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs).
- Operating 6 Disaster Loan Outreach Centers (DLOCs) throughout the state.
  - SBA Customer Services Representatives are available at each location to meet with homeowners, renters, and non-farm businesses of all sizes to provide program information, help applicants complete paperwork and forms, and to close approved SBA disaster loans.
- Staff at the Joint Field Office (JFO) to coordinate all needs with federal, state, and local partners. SBA has Communication Specialists in the Joint Information Center (JIC) and in the field to handle all SBA media and congressional inquiries.
- Continues to sponsor a Business Recovery Center (BRC) at Westdale Mall in Cedar Rapids, where SBA
  has assisted over 1,800 visitors at the center.
  - Available to answer specific questions about how a disaster loan may help each business and to help owners' complete business loan applications.
  - Sponsors the availability of multiple additional services at the BRC and there is no charge for any of the services.
    - Business owners may obtain assistance in applying for low-interest U. S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Loans, and gain access to government contracts and procurement through U. S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Government Contracting.
    - Iowa Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and SCORE "Counselors to America's Small Business" are providing assistance with reconstruction of lost financial records, development of business plans and cash flow projections, how to obtain lost tax returns and submit casualty loss claims on tax returns, adjusting to market changes as a result of the flooding, tornadoes and severe storms, and other post-disaster counseling services. These services are free.
    - The DRCs and the DLOCs have contact information on how businesses may obtain these same counseling services from their local SCORE chapter, regional SBDC office and the lowa Women's Enterprise Center for businesses that may not be located near the Cedar Rapids BRC.
