## Policeman Nabs Hot Lotto J ackpot of \$1.65 Million

A Des Moines police officer took some time off the beat to start out his new year by claiming a $\$ 1.65$ million Hot Lotto jackpot.

Danny Good, a 27-year veteran of the police department, became the fourth Iowa Lottery player to win a Hot

"I'm going to make sure I'm debt free and take care of my mom," he said. "She doesn't want to move, so we'll get her house upgraded, get her a new car and give her a little cash in the bankpretty much take care of her and myself. And I have a brother and sister, I'll give them a little money and help them out and then just sit back and relax."

Good, 50, won the jackpot in the Hot Lotto drawing on Dec. 20, but said he waited to claim his prize until after the beginning of the year for tax purposes. He said he learned he had won the jackpot when he called the lottery's recorded winning numbers line the night of the drawing and listened to the results.
"I started writing the numbers down and they were falling right in line with what I usually play," he said. "I checked them again and I called the lottery number back and wrote the numbers down again and re-verified that I heard what I heard."

Good said he plays a combination of family and friends’ birth dates and ages. He chose to receive his jackpot winnings in a lumpsum payment of \$989,802.04.

Good bought his winning ticket at the Quik Trip at 5169 Merle Hay Road in Johnston.

Good said he doesn't plan anything extravagant with his winnings, and he plans to continue working.
"I'll maybe buy some property - buy a little piece of land and a house. I'll just take it easy," he said.

## Des Moines Residents Celebrate $\mathbf{\$ 1 0 0 , 0 0 0}$ Wins

Des Moines’ Willa Head celebrated her $\$ 100,000$ win at lottery headquarters by claiming her prize the morning of Jan. 2. The celebrating continued later in the day when Daniel Ramirez, also of Des Moines, claimed his $\$ 100,000$ prize.

Ramirez, 37, who works for the U.S. Postal Service, said he almost didn't buy a ticket for the drawing.
"I was actually in a hurry," he said. "I bought it right before work, and it was on New

Is he glad he took the time to make his purchase?
"I'm actually more composed than I thought I would be," he said with a laugh as he claimed his prize. "Not until I'm holding this check is it reality."

Head, who works as a bus associate for the Des Moines Public School District, said she watched the Powerball drawing and realized almost immediately that she had won a big prize.
"I saw the numbers on television. I wrote them down quickly and got my ticket, and I was looking at the numbers, and I kept looking at the numbers," she said. "Then I fell back on the bed and I said, 'What do I do? What do I do?' And then I didn't sleep."
Neither Head nor Ramirez chose the Power Play, which would have multiplied their prizes to $\$ 300,000$.

Head bought her ticket at the Quik Trip at 2300 M.L. King Jr. Parkway in Des Moines while Ramirez purchased his at the Quik Trip at 1501 E. Grand Ave. in Des Moines.

Ramirez said he and his wife have some immediate plans for his winnings and some long-term ideas: First come a "Rugrats" video and roller skates for their daughter and anything, "even a pack of gum," to make their 3-year-old son happy.
"I plan on paying my debt and getting a new car and I think just maybe sitting on it and decide what I want to do from there," Ramirez said.

Head said she plans to save for retirement and pay a few bills with her winnings.

## Sioux City Auto Store Manager Claims Prize

Donnie and Lynette O’Dell of South Sioux City, Neb. claimed a third \$100,000 prize on Jan. 7.

Donnie, 48, who manages an auto shop in Sioux City, said a lottery employee who was getting work done on his van clued him in that a $\$ 100,000-$ winning Powerball ticket had been sold at a nearby Kum \& Go. Donnie, who purchases his tickets at the same store, said his ticket was sitting on the kitchen

"He said, 'Did you check your ticket? And I said no, not yet. I decided I probably should go home and check that ticket. That's what I did, and guess what? That was the ticket!" Donnie said.

They purchased their winning ticket at Kum \& Go, 2930 Gordon Drive, Sioux City.

The O'Dells have no definite plans for their winnings yet.
"It hasn’t soaked it yet all the way!" Donnie said.

## Winning Numbers Report Represents Iowa Winners

During the recent Powerball jackpot run, retailers printed out a lot of winning numbers reports for Powerball.

Retailers should note that the report they receive from their terminal lists Iowa winners of Powerball only. So, if the jackpot is won in another state, it will print " 0 " under "Wins" for the jackpot on the report. The same is true for the report on the lottery's web site.

The Hot Lotto winners report from
 your terminal also represents only Iowa winners.
