Influenza activity jumps - three flu strains identified

Just in time for National Influenza Vaccination Week, the State Hygienic Laboratory identified all three strains of influenza in patient specimens submitted from three different regions of Iowa. The strains were confirmed to be influenza A (H3N2), 2009 H1N1, and influenza B. All three are covered by this year's influenza vaccine. Nationally, many states are reporting increases in activity indicating that flu season has arrived.

With confirmed activity throughout the state, now is the time to encourage influenza vaccination. Those that receive the vaccine this week will be protected in time for holiday gatherings. Additionally, with all three strains circulating, there is a possibility that patients may be infected with more than one strain of influenza. This is yet another reason to encourage vaccination.

CADE project on varicella outbreaks

The Center for Acute Disease Epidemiology is requesting that counties, schools and health providers report clusters of chickenpox cases in pre-school and school age children. CADE is participating in an ongoing investigation of varicella vaccine effectiveness; CADE staff will assist local agencies in collecting aggregate data on number of affected children, number of immunized children, and numbers of lesions.

This effort does not change our current disease reporting policies. Individual varicella cases are not reportable, but suspected outbreaks are. CADE staff will not be requesting information on individuals, nor providing information on individuals to the CDC.
