Influenza activity is increasing, three strains circulating

lowans who have not yet gotten their seasonal influenza shot should do so immediately. lowa's influenza surveillance system indicates three different strains of flu (all covered by the vaccine) were circulating in lowa last week. In addition, the number of hospitalizations due to influenza doubled in the last week.

It's not too late to get a flu shot, but without vaccination it will possible to get the flu three times this year. After illness with one strain of the flu, a person does NOT develop immunity to the other strains.
