Did you know?

The Tobacco Division is working on a statewide program that would combine retail enforcement of tobacco, alcohol, and lottery sales. Currently, only tobacco enforcement is standardized across the state and coordinated by a single agency.

JEL rallies teens at the state football tournament

Instead of holding an event in conjunction with the Great American Smokeout (GASO), teens with Just Eliminate Lies (JEL) decided to take their message directly to high school students.

JEL youth gathered at the UNI-Dome in Cedar Falls at the lowa High School Class 2A and 3A State Football championships this past weekend to show their

support and to get teens to "See the Connection" between tobacco use and its effects.

The youth gathered in groups and handed out rally towels to the participating teams according to their teams colors. They also had sandwich boards with "connections" of how tobacco use effects the user and the people around them they care about the most, such as the secondhand smoke from a loved one causing asthma in a child.

"This is the first time in a long while that JEL will not have an official GASO event," said Garin Buttermore, JEL Coordinator. "The youth felt that their time and JEL's money would be better served with this change."

Quitline Iowa supports ACS and the 'Smokeout'

Each year, the third Thursday of November is the Great American Smokeout (GASO), a day set aside for smokers to try to quit.

However, the American Cancer Society (ACS) issued an unexpected message this year: Do not quit smoking today.

In a press release, ACS stated that "We urge smokers to mark today's 34th Great American Smokeout by making a quit plan and finding out about free resources that help them quit successfully. Research shows that advance planning and preparation greatly increase the likelihood of succeeding."

The Tobacco Division (and Quitline Iowa) supported the event by issuing a statewide press release and giving a handful of interviews.

Karla Akers Recognized for Well Workplace Award

On October 1, 2009, Cass County Health System (CCHS) struck gold when they were recognized by WELCOA as having a wellness program worthy of a Gold award designation. Only 59 organizations out of 5,000 lowa applicants received an Gold, Silver, or Bronze award.

Kara Akers was part of the wellness committee that crafted and implemented the award-winning

program.

A Gold award designation is achieved when an organization has in place wellness initiatives focused on physical

activity, nutrition, stress management, tobacco

cessation, and selfcare. Moreover, these wellness initiatives must lead to measurable outcomes or results (change in biometrics, reduction in cholesterol, etc.).

"Over the past year, about a dozen of us have worked really hard on this," said Akers. "I did a lot on telling employees about our cessation benefit."
