Suicide Prevention Walks Scheduled

According to the Iowa Department of Public Health, suicide is the second leading cause of death for Iowans between the ages of 15 and 40. According to the 2008 Iowa Youth Survey, 17 percent of 11th grade girls admitted to attempting suicide, yet most suicide deaths are male because of the lethal means used (primarily firearms).

Suicide injuries and death can be prevented and the stigma surrounding suicide can be reduced by openly acknowledging suicide, and directly addressing the depression and other stressors associated with it. The lowa "Out of the Darkness" walks are for anyone who cares about the issues surrounding suicide, but are especially designed for those who have lost friends or family to suicide.

"The walks are an important way for lowans to honor and remember loved ones they've lost, as well as reduce the stigma associated with talking about suicide," said IDPH Behavioral Health Division Director Kathy Stone. "As we learn more about suicide, we can be alert for signs and symptoms and seek help when needed for ourselves and those we care about."

These events help fund the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention's (AFSP) ongoing efforts with research, education and prevention initiatives. They also provide suicide prevention funding for the community that hosts the walk. There are five "Out of Darkness" walks scheduled across lowa:

- August 22 at City Park in Iowa City
- September 19 at the DMACC Lake, Building 7, in Ankeny
- September 26 at Memorial Park in Royal
- October 2 at Southbridge Mall in Mason City
- October 9 at Noelridge Park in Cedar Rapids

Participants at the Ankeny and Iowa City walks are encouraged to help create a large memory board by bringing a 5" X 7" picture or memento of a loved one lost to suicide.

Other Suicide Awareness and Prevention events held earlier this year include an AFSP College Campus Walk in Ft. Dodge in June with over 200 walkers who raised \$21,000, and a 5K run in Dunkerton that involved over 400 participants and raised \$12,000.
