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2010 Meat Animal Production and Value

Iowa: The 2010 gross income from cattle and calves, hogs and pigs, and sheep and lambs for Iowa totaled \$8.34 billion, up from \$6.93 billion in 2009. Gross income increased 18 percent for cattle and calves, 21 percent for hogs and pigs, and 21 percent for sheep and lambs.

United States: Total 2010 production of cattle and calves, hogs and pigs, and sheep and lambs for the U.S. totaled 72.4 billion pounds, down 1 percent from 2009. Production decreased 3 percent for hogs and pigs, 4 percent for sheep and lambs, but increased 1 percent for cattle and calves.

Total 2010 cash receipts from marketings of meat animals increased 19 percent to \$70.0 billion. Cattle and calves accounted for over 73 percent of this total, hogs and pigs nearly 26 percent, and sheep and lambs less than 1 percent.

The 2010 gross income from cattle and calves, hogs and pigs, and sheep and lambs for the U.S. totaled \$70.5 billion, up 19 percent from 2009. Gross income for cattle and calves increased 17 percent, hogs and pigs increased 22 percent, and sheep and lambs increased 22 percent over previous year's gross income.

Cattle and Calves: Cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves increased 17 percent from \$43.9 billion in 2009 to \$51.5 billion in 2010. All cattle and calf marketings totaled 55.5 billion pounds in 2010, up 2 percent from 2009.

Hogs and Pigs: Cash receipts from hogs and pigs totaled \$17.9 billion during 2010, up 22 percent from 2009. Marketings totaled 31.4 billion pounds in 2010, down 5 percent from 2009.

Sheep and Lambs: Cash receipts from marketings of sheep and lambs in 2010 were \$544 million, up 22 percent from 2009. Marketings decreased 3 percent to 493 million pounds.

2010 Milk Production and Value

Iowa: Milk production totaled 4.34 billion pounds for 2010, down from 4.38 in 2009. The average number of milk cows was 209,000 head, down 3 percent from a year earlier. Production per cow was 20,751 pounds, up 2 percent from 2009. The value of milk produced increased to \$716 million from the 2009 value of \$578 million.

United States: Milk production increased 2 percent in 2010 to 193 billion pounds. The rate per cow, at 21,149 pounds, was 576 pounds above 2009. The annual average number of milk cows on farms was 9.12 million head, down 86,000 head from 2009.

Cash receipts from marketings of milk during 2010 totaled \$31.4 billion, 29 percent higher than 2009. Producer returns averaged \$16.35 per hundredweight, 26 percent above 2009. Marketings totaled 191.8 billion pounds, 2 percent above 2009. Marketings include whole milk sold to plants and dealers and milk sold directly to consumers.

An estimated 991 million pounds of milk were used on farms where produced, 2 percent less than 2009. Calves were fed 89 percent of this milk, with the remainder consumed in producer households.

2010 Poultry Production and Value

Iowa: The Iowa value of sales from chickens (excluding broilers) during 2010 was \$103,000, down 9 percent from \$113,000 the previous year. The Iowa value of all egg production in 2010 was \$824 million, up 9 percent from \$756 million in 2009. Egg production totaled 14.6 billion eggs, up 1 percent from 14.5 billion eggs produced in 2009.

United States: The combined value of production from broilers, eggs, turkeys, and the value of sales from chickens in 2010 was \$34.7 billion, up 10 percent from the \$31.6 billion in 2009. Of the combined total, 68 percent was from broilers, 19 percent from eggs, 13 percent from turkeys, and less than 1 percent from chickens.

The value of broilers produced during 2010 was \$23.7 billion, up 9 percent from 2009. The total number of broilers produced in 2010 was 8.63 billion, up 1 percent from 2009. The total amount of live weight broilers produced in 2010 was 49.2 billion pounds, up 3 percent from 2009.

Value of all egg production in 2010 was \$6.52 billion, up 6 percent from the \$6.17 billion in 2009. Egg production totaled 91.4 billion eggs, up 1 percent from the 90.5 billion eggs produced in 2009.

The value of turkeys produced during 2010 was \$4.37 billion, up 22 percent from the \$3.57 billion the previous year. Turkey production in 2010 totaled 7.11 billion pounds, down 1 percent from the 7.15 billion pounds produced in 2009.

The value of sales from chickens (excluding broilers) in 2010 was \$72.0 million, up 11 percent from the \$65.1 million a year ago. The number of chickens sold in 2010 totaled 173 million, down 2 percent from the total sold during the previous year.
